COUNCIL CORNER

September 8, 2025 Regular Council Meeting Reports:

CAO:

Council asked if the town could obtain a quote for lighting going north along Waskasoo Ave to the new operations site.

Since last meeting there has been a commercial business request and one new house.

Offsite Levies are in the works with the engineering team doing the final changes. Following this a meeting will occur with potential developers, an open house will be held, and then a public hearing. Hopefully process will be completed by end of year.

Ongoing discussion with Melcor to get several varying projects up and running.

Multiplex:

Great to see the numbers are over 12,000 coming through the doors monthly.

Monthly power savings were approx. \$5,404.

Operations:

E Billing service is now at 44% of all utility accounts.

Road maintenance for sweeping crack filling and alleys were performed over the last month.

RV Park had 118 bookings for the month of August. Average night use was 51 stalls.

Focus on maintenance around town; with roads, parks, spray park, pathways, etc.

Upcoming projects to watch for: signage for the disc golf stations installed; sewer line replacement Lucina Street.

New pathway along Lincoln Street to Waskasoo; installation of historical grain elevator signage.

Request for Decisions:

Tax Sale: there will be six manufactured homes going up for tax sale this year. Sale date is scheduled for Nov 10.

Council Boards/Committees:

Penhold & District Library showed their summer stats for 2025. 1186 attendees/ with 166 programs ran this past summer. Great work by the Library team.

Council Round table:

A request was made if the lighting at Lincoln Street Rec Centre could be turned on to light up the basketball court and area; just like is done for the arena use in winter.

September 22, 2025 Regular Council Meeting

Nomination Day has come and passed. We have six councillors acclaimed and two candidates in the mayoral race. The new team of councillors is: Teresa Cunningham, Ken Denson, Cameron Galisky, Shaun Kranenborg, Tyrone Muller and Kathy Sitter.

Election Day is October 20, 2025. (see page 5 for more details)

Reports:

CAO:

The Town has requested pricing for lighting along Waskasoo Ave., North of Highway #42; this quote will be for installation on the current power poles.

Highway 2A has one way traffic for straight through at HawkrIDGE Blvd. Council asked to ensure there is also street signage for winter conditions.

Melcor is working on a playground area just off Oxford Blvd on the north side of Hwy 42. A design is being developed with possible earth dirt work this fall.

Alberta Transportation & Economic Corridors will be doing an overlay on Highway 2A north of Town and on Hwy

#42 by the overpass at Highway 2. This should commence next week.
An expression of appreciation to Council was presented by CAO Binnendyk on behalf of all staff for the past 4 years working so well together as a team. SO APPRECIATED.

FCSS:

Summer Play Days was a great success this year with some days reaching 50 participants.
Discovery Night was a great opportunity to connect with various groups in town. A great event unfortunately attendance was a little light. (Perhaps timing of event?)
PYC had great summer camps this year with enthusiastic campers and fun filled day sessions.
Fall Festival: A W E S O M E. What more can be said; from start to finish the event was well organized; it was great seeing staff participant and we had the perfect weather.
Stay connected to see what is occurring in Town. Oh, so much to check out.

Fire & Protective Services:

Speed zone has been put into place in front of the new middle school.
Fire Dept. received a grant from Firehouse Subs. A special thank you for their financial contribution. Check out their new Fire House Subs location in Gasoline Alley.
In August 75% of the calls were EMS/Rescue.
Community Peace Officers had a substantive focus on unsightly parcels with weeds/grass that needs attending to.
New Public Services Building has the steel up, roof installed, concrete had been poured for the aprons. No cost concerns at this stage.

Past Councillor Mike Walsh, will be recognized by Alberta Munis at this fall’s convention for the Award of Excellence for outstanding civic leadership as an elected official.

Next Council meeting: After the election, November 3 which will include the Regular Council meeting and Organizational Meeting.

Canada Post Strike The current Canada Post strike is affecting the delivery of utility bills, permits, licenses, payments, and other Town of Penhold correspondence but it will not impact election procedures. The Town of Penhold does not mail out voter cards to residents because there is only one (1) polling station located at the Penhold Multiplex on Election Day. **Advance voting is held in the Penhold & District Library Saturday October 11 from 2:00-6:00 p.m.*

Voter Registration

NEW for 2025: Legislative changes in 2024 require municipalities to work with Elections Alberta to maintain a Permanent Electors Register. Registering early makes the voting process faster and easier, because you won't have to register at the polling station on Election Day. Your privacy is important. VoterLink is a provincial registration system, and your information will be shared with your municipality for electoral purposes only.

The online registry is now closed. Voters who have not registered, or who need to update their information (including change of address), will need to register in person at the voting station before receiving a ballot.

Seasonal water main & hydrant flushing has begun

Flushing of Water & Sewer Mains

Water and sewer mains are flushed in the spring and fall as part of our regular infrastructure maintenance. Fall flushing is scheduled to commence in the second half of September. More information will be posted on the Town website.

This process may cause you to experience dirty water. To clear your lines please let your cold-water tap run until clear. If the problem persists, please give us a call at 403-886-3282.



Yard Waste Compost are located at the Ball Diamonds for the rest of the 2025 season.

Weather dependant, the anticipated closing date for the bins will be October 31, 2025.

This is a great service to have, please follow the rules and help us keep this great service available!

Please remember that **NO BAGS OF ANY KIND** are to be placed in the yard waste compost bins.

Grass must be dumped out of garbage bags and placed as far back in the bins as possible.

Do not dispose of animal feces in the yard waste bins.

Ensure woody branch material goes into the branches bin and grass clippings/ soft plant material in the grass bin.

Please do not mix them up as the woody material is chipped and the clippings are composted.

Sani Dump

The anticipated closing date of the Sani dump is **October 31, 2025**. Please note this date is weather dependant.



Street Sweeping

The Operations Department does a minimum of two thorough street sweeps a year.

The Operations team will be signing streets for no parking late in the day for street sweeping on the following day, please watch for signs. This means streets are signed for no parking during the day so that the sweeper can get the entire area.

Christmas Lights on Trees on Boulevards

Some residents enjoy decorating trees within the boulevards with lights. This is acceptable; however, we ask that if residents choose to do this, they remove the Christmas lights off the trees prior to March 1st the following spring.

Prune Your Elm Tree

Pruning is one of the most important ways we can help an elm tree. Because of the threat of Dutch elm disease, special considerations must be considered. Unlike many other tree species, pruning must be done at a very specific time of year. Because open wounds attract the **elm bark beetle** (the major vector for Dutch elm disease), pruning should be done between November 1 and March 31.

Where does your sump pump drain?

We are asking all residents to help in protecting our community spaces by ensuring your sump pumps are complaint with the Utility Bylaw 833/2024. Discharging sump pump water into parks, green spaces, sidewalks, or storm sewers is not allowed.

Why it matters:

- Erodes and damages property
- Creates standing water and slippery hazards on sidewalks
- Overloads our storm system when water is drained illegally into sewers
- Increases maintenance costs for everyone
- Can pose safety risks for kids, pets, and other residents



With the recent dry weather, it’s been easier to spot where sump pumps are draining onto public property — and it’s causing noticeable damage. Town staff have found several instances of buried discharge lines where sink holes are now evident.

If you have your sump pump routed underground from you’re your home or business, please redirect the line onto your own property, in accordance with Town bylaws. Staff will continue monitoring and following up on violations, which may result in enforcement action or fines.



Postal Strike impact on utility bills

The Town Penhold utility bills still need to be paid during the Canada Post strike. Town of Penhold utility bills are generated after reads are complete for the 15th of the month, payments are due the 10th of each month. Penalties will be charged on any outstanding balances after the due date, these penalties will not be reversed.

During the strike, utility bills can be paid online through your bank, by autmated debit or in person at the Town Office.

We encourage residents to sign up for the Town’s e-billing program to have their bills delivered via email. Check the Town of Penhold website for details and to register for E-Billing.

If you have an **existing** Town of Penhold Pet License, you are eligible for the Early Renewal Discount if you renew your Pet License before Dec.31. New tags are not required with renewals. **Early Renewal Discount applies on existing licenses only, new Pet Licenses do not qualify for renewal discount.*

If licenses are renewed October 1 to December 31, the following rates apply:

Unaltered Animal: \$30 Altered Animal: \$15

Pedestrian safety is a mutual responsibility

Pedestrians must look and be seen, follow traffic signals, and cross at marked crosswalks, while drivers must yield to pedestrians at all marked and unmarked crosswalks.

Both parties are advised to exercise caution, especially as we get into low light conditions with fall. Pedestrians are encouraged to wear high visibility clothing. Distractions like phones should be avoided, and children should only cross streets with an adult until they can safely assess traffic.

For Pedestrians:

- **Be visible:** Wear bright coloured or reflective clothing.
- **Cross Safely:** Use marked crossing where available. Wait for signals. Make eye contact with drivers to ensure they see you.
- **Be Alert:** Look for vehicles in all direction, including behind you, and listen for traffic.
- **Avoid Distractions:** Do not use your phone or listen to music while crossing the street.
- **If No Sidewalk:** Walk facing oncoming traffic, as far from the road as possible.
- **Obey Signals:** Follow all traffic signs and signals for your safety.



For Drivers:

- **Yield to Pedestrians:** Slow down and yield to pedestrians at all marked and unmarked crosswalks.
- **Be Cautious in Key Areas:** Pay extra attention in school zones, playground zones, and highway crossings where children cross often.
- **Use Headlights:** Ensure your headlights are on to improve visibility for pedestrians.
- **Slow for Flashing Lights:** When approaching a flashing crosswalk, slow to 30km/hr and yield to any pedestrians.

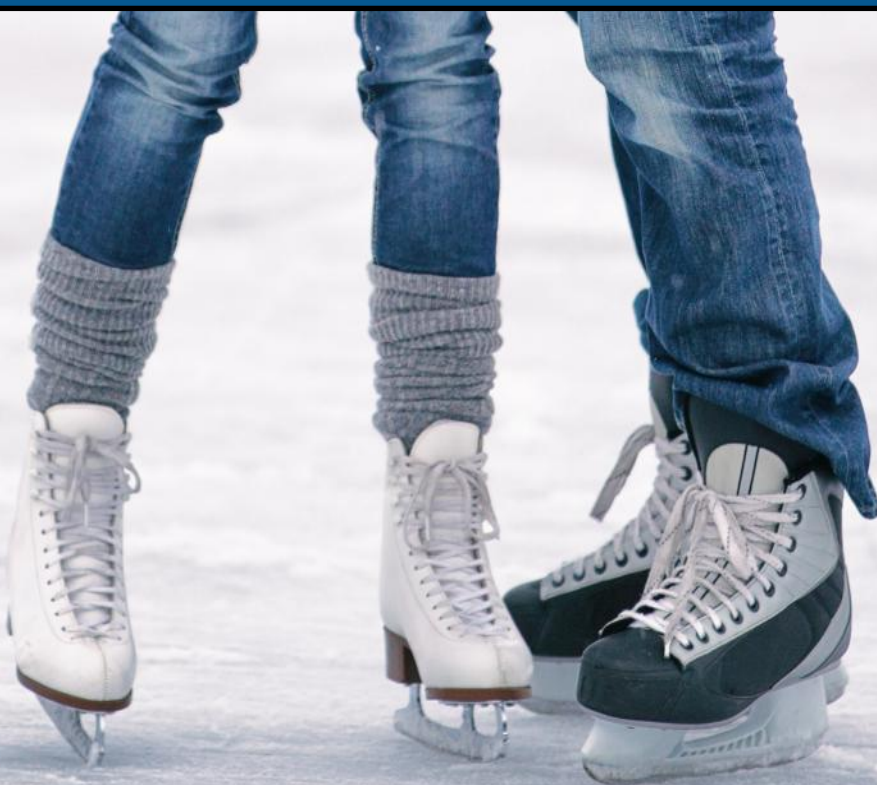

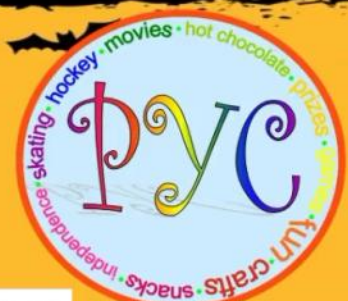

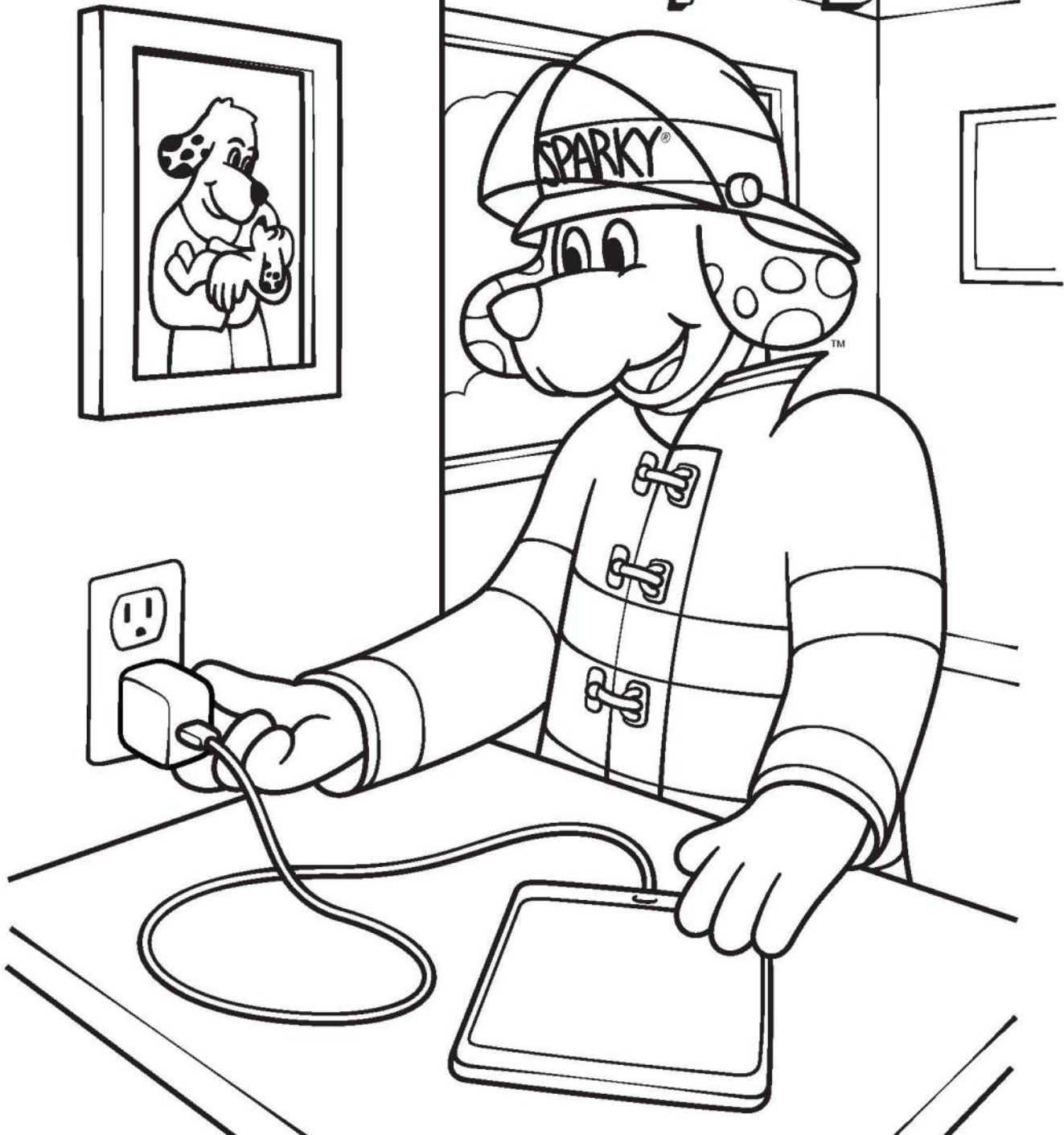
