COUNCIL CORNER

Jan. 13, 2025 Regular Council Meeting:

Innisfail Chamber of Commerce: Made a presentation to Council to encourage the Town of Penhold to become a member of the Innisfail & District Chamber. Key items of membership are: connection with area businesses through a variety of ways; a combined voice in the Province and Federal realms on business matters; benefits program for staff working with small businesses.

2025 Municipal Elections have seen major changes in how the election process will work. This will have a direct impact on staff time in delivering this new service to the residents.

BREWD (Business Retention and Expansion Strategy and a Workforce Development Strategy), the new economic focus group initiative, has connected with 34 businesses in Town and had consultation with 28 businesses.

The official Launch for this project was January 23, 2025. (see page 4 for more info)

Penhold Multiplex: in December, 14,486 patrons visited the complex with a yearly total of 209,776 visitors to the Multiplex.

In 2024, the solar panels installed on the Multiplex roof saved the Town enough power to provide power to approx. 24 average size homes.

Memorial Hall floors have been re-finished and look amazing. The linoleum and wood floors were completely refurbished.

Penhold achievements and focuses for 2025: Council was provided an extensive list of both 2024 achievements and 2025 focuses. The listing will be uploaded to the town's website for review.

The Dog Park Committee is working to start the development of Penhold's first off leash dog park. They have submitted a grant application to the province and are requesting a letter of support from Council. Council congratulated the group on moving this project forward.

Inter-municipal Development Planning: Council gave final approval to the Inter-municipal Development Plan (IDP) with the County of Red Deer. This will be a guiding document for future planning with our bordering neighbours.

Utility Increase: Council approved an increase in utilities; with the substantive increase from the Regional Waste Water Sewer System the town was forced to pass on the sewer costs. Residents will experience no increase to the water fee however with the sewer increase, residents can expect to see an increase between 5 and 7% depending on the usage amount. Commercial properties will experience a similar increase of approx. 7%. For the heavy users this will plateau at 500 cubes at which time the fee will drop down by \$1.00 per cube or 22% per cube.

Key Notes From January 27th, Council Meeting

Council Presentations:

Mr. Stewart Ford made a presentation to council about the development of an Armillary. This is a globe type of design that acts as a sundial, giving dates and months of the year. This would a be great attribute and provide a unique learning experience for the community.

Council expressed gratitude to Mr. Ford for this generous donation to the town commemorating the 120 years since Penhold's incorporation.

Atco Franchise agreement: was approved by Alberta Utilities Commission and will continue in the same way the agreement has for past years.

BREWD: (Business Retention Expansion Workforce Development) had its official launch Jan 23rd. This project will be ongoing for the next 1 ½ years, promoting businesses. (see page 4 for further details)

Land Use Bylaw: (LUB) is under review by the Municipal Planning Commission. The focus is updating the bylaw to meet current legislation, streamlining development options, addressing ongoing variance requests and making the bylaw easier for interpretation/understanding. The Commission hopes to have this ready for Council by the end of April.

Penhold Cares Community Blood Drive Challenge: will be occurring for the month of February. Please go and donate blood this month and make sure you put your stone in the jar to tell everyone Penhold Cares. (More info on page 5)

It's time to roll up our sleeves and make a life-saving difference! The Town of Penhold and Canadian Blood Services are excited to announce the launch of the second annual Penhold Cares Central Alberta Blood Drive Challenge, running from February 1 to 28, 2025.

The Town of Penhold is challenging everyone in Central Alberta to book an appointment and donate blood at the **Canadian Blood Services Donor Centre in Red Deer** this February. But that's not all—donors will get to represent one of six zones in the region, battling it out to see which area can claim the title of **Top Donor Zone!**

Penhold Mayor Mike Yargeau says "We started this challenge last year with Canadian Blood Services to honour the world record set by Penhold resident, Josephine Michaluk, for most whole blood donations by a female."

Central Alberta, the challenge is on! In a thrilling twist, all donors at the Red Deer Centre will be asked to indicate which of six zones they are representing.

"Last year, Penhold showed up in a big way, securing the third-highest number of donors among all zones. This year, let's prove just how much heart our small town has and aim for the top spot," says Yargeau. OPERATIONS

2025 Utility Rates

Council approved a new Utility Bylaw which will be reflected on the January 2025 bill. There will be an increase in rates to reflect actual cost recovery. Penhold continues to have competitive rates for utilities in the area. The rates are posted on the website.

Sewer Fixed – increase of \$3.00/month from \$18.00 to \$21.00/month.

Sewer usage – increase of \$0.42/M³ from \$3.95/M³ to \$4.37/M³ (Increase includes regional commission rates)






Outdoor Rink

The Outdoor Rink at Lincoln Street Recreation area is now open for the season. The rink shelter and outdoor rink are open for use from 11:00 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. daily (closed for maintenance 8:30- 1 1:00 a.m. daily).

During the week, Town of Penhold staff clear snow from the ice and flood each morning. The flooding is done by hand rather than with an ice resurfacing machine. The process takes time, please be patient and abide by operating times to allow staff adequate time to complete the work and keep the ice the best it can be for everyone's enjoyment.

The rink is flooded on weekdays and is not flooded on the weekends, shovels are available for users to clear snow from the rink when needed.



Stay Off the Ice

Unlike regular ponds in the rural areas, storm retention ponds can have water flowing into these systems anytime during the winter months. These storm retention ponds will not be measured for ice depth.

For everyone's safety stay off the ice as there is always the danger of thin ice.

The Community Hub Pond Aeration system runs year-round and assists with the natural oxygenation process of the water body to help combat harsh winter conditions. This will result in open water throughout the winter and thin ice. Signs have been placed in the area, stay off this pond as well as all other storm ponds throughout town as water may be flowing underneath the surface and the ice levels are not monitored.

Lincoln Street Storm Pond

The Lincoln Street Storm Pond is a designated and licensed snow dumping site for the Operations Department and is not meant for recreational use. Trucks and equipment are using the site while snow removal is in progress. Please avoid using the area during this time.


Snow Removal

Our Operations staff make every effort to ensure that our streets are clear of snow and ice during the winter months. Please be patient as we complete this process. Snow plowing and/or removal on streets will be started after a heavy snowfall (15cm) or once accumulations have reached 15cm.

The priority areas are as follow:

- Priority one includes main thoroughfares and bus routes.
- Priority two are businesses, streets, and avenues.
- **Priority three** are Closes, Courts, and Places these are cleared once all other major areas are complete.

The snow removal priority map is available on the Town of Penhold Website.



The snow removal process may take three weeks or longer depending on snow fall, conditions, and workload. Should another 15cm of snow accumulate during the snow removal process, priorities will shift back to one and two. Snow will be windrowed until removal is possible. Where applicable, snow will be windrowed to the side of the street without a sidewalk.

Please use extra care when approaching snow removal equipment as visibility is limited and equipment may stop and/or back up suddenly.

Residents are responsible for snow removal on all sidewalks adjacent to their home. Please consider neighbours and delivery people by clearing your sidewalks. Snow must be removed within 72 hours of any snowfall. Snow that is cleaned off sidewalks and driveways cannot be deposited onto the road. (Traffic Bylaw 754.2018 Section 18.4)





No Parking Signs

The Operations staff will make every attempt to put out No Parking signs the day before planned street sweeping or snow removal. There is no parking on the road during the hours posted until the signs are removed.

Vehicles are considered towable if they are not in accordance with the posted street sign in accordance with Traffic Bylaw 754.2018 Section 18.8.

If the Operations crew is not able to complete street sweeping/snow removal on the day planned, the signs will remain up until removal is completed. If you are unsure when snow removal is taking place, please call the Operations Department at 403-886-4265.

Signs are placed out prior to 4:30pm the day before maintenance begins. You can also receive updates by email by signing up for the E-News through the Town of Penhold website.

Winter Road Safety Reminders

Driver fatigue is a risk when driving in Alberta's winter conditions. To reduce the risk of fatigue, you can:

- Plan ahead: Get enough sleep before a long trip and avoid driving during your body's "down time"
- Take breaks: Schedule breaks every two hours or every 160km
- Drive with a passenger: Have someone to chat with who can also let you know if you're showing signs of fatigue
- Drive defensively: Accelerate gently, turn slowly, and brake carefully and early
- Reduce speed: Reduce speed when approaching intersections covered with ice or snow
- Allow extra time: Allow for extra travelling time or delay a trip if the weather is inclement

Don't forget to winterize your vehicle, keep your vehicle fueled, and keep an emergency kit in your vehicle.





Residents are reminded that snowmobiling is not permitted within town limits, including all green spaces.

This restriction is in place to ensure safety and enjoyment of these spaces for all residents and to protect the integrity of our shared community resources.

Why snowmobiling is not allowed:

- Legal Restrictions: Snowmobiles are not legally permitted within
 Penhold town limits. Operating a snowmobile in Penhold violates Bylaw
 828/2024. (Section 4.9 restricts parking and driving of any vehicle,
 including snowmobiles, on Town land) and may result in fines or other
 penalties. Additionally, the Alberta Traffic Safety Act part 6 restricts
 Off-Highway Vehicles from driving on any primary or secondary highway
 and their right of ways and also restricts the use of any vehicle
 (including OHV) on all roads unless they are: registered, insured,
 operated by a licensed operator, wearing helmets, have operating
 headlamps and tail lamps, have a valid licence plate.
- Preventing Damage to Park Resources: Snow-covered areas may conceal small trees, shrubs, grass, park furniture, and infrastructure.
 Snowmobiles can cause significant damage to these elements, which are vital to maintaining the beauty and functionality of our parks.
- Ensuring Safety for People and Pets: Parks are often used by families, pedestrians and pet owners during winter months. Snowmobiles pose a risk of harm or negative interactions with individuals enjoying these spaces on foot.

We appreciate your cooperation in respecting these guidelines. Let's work together to ensure our parks remain safe and beautiful for everyone to enjoy. If you have any questions, please contact the Town Office.

The event began with a ceremonial puck drop by Mitch Thomson, Executive Director of the Red Deer Food Bank and concluded with a final score of 8-5 in favour of the Bowden Corrections Officers.

The real winner of the evening was the Red Deer Food Bank who received 770 lbs of food and \$925 after the game. Thank you to everyone who attended the game and contributed to this meaningful event!



Do you have a person in your life who may be a hoarder? Hoarding is a condition where a person has persistent difficulty discarding personal possessions. The large amount of possessions fill the home and prevent the normal use of the space. Living space becomes cluttered. It may be unusable. Hoarding brings distress and emotional health concerns.

WHY HOARDING INCREASES FIRE RISKS

- Cooking is unsafe if flammable items are close to the stove or oven.
- Heating units may be too close to things that can burn. They might also be placed on unstable surfaces.
 If a heater tips over into a pile, it can cause a fire.
- Electrical wiring may be old or worn from the weight of piles. Pests could chew on wires. Damaged wires can start fires.
- Open flames from smoking materials or candles in a home with excess clutter are very dangerous.
- Blocked pathways and exits may hinder escape from a fire.

HOW HOARDING IMPACTS FIRST RESPONDERS

- Hoarding puts first responders in harm's way.
- Firefighters cannot move swiftly through a home filled with clutter.
- Responders can be trapped in a home when exits are blocked. They can be injured by objects falling from piles.
- The weight of the stored items, especially if water is added to put out a fire, can lead to building collapse.
- Fighting fires is very risky in a hoarding home. It is hard to enter the home to provide medical care.
 The clutter impedes the search and rescue of people and pets.


How Can You Help Reduce the Risk of Fire Injury

- When talking a person who hoards, focus on safety rather than the clutter. Be empathetic. Match the person's language. If they call it hoarding, then you can call it hoarding.
- Help the residents make a home safety and escape plan. Stress the importance of clear pathways and exits. Practice the plan often. Exit routes may change as new items are brought into the home.
- Install working smoke alarms in the home. Test them at least once a month.
- Reach out to community resources. Talk to members of the fire department to alert them of your concerns. They may be able to connect you with members of a hoarding task force for additional help.


