COUNCIL CORNER

March 10, 2025 Council Meeting Highlights

As Administration works through the 2025 Budget, the Provincial budgets have been announced. It appears the school requisition has increased 6.27% and the seniors requisition has increased by 11 % over last year. This is not an increase driven by the municipality however each community must collect the taxes on behalf of the Province.

Budgets and tax rates are anticipated to be finalized before the end of March.

We are excited to share that E-Billing is now available for taxes in Penhold!

Operations Manager Brandon Kowalchuk submitted the Alberta Environment and Protect Areas Water Works System Inspection Report. The Report identified above average ratings throughout the report with no deficiencies within the water systems. Council requested that this report be placed on the town's website for public preview.

The Operations team has done an excellent job being proactive with spring drainage in the alleys. It appears past issues have been resolved.

Multiplex Manager Szewczuk presented a new Ice Allocation Policy to Council providing local users the opportunity to secure ice times. The Policy identifies "local users" as residents who live within the Penhold and Red Deer County

recreational area site plan area. Council approved the Policy with the eligible areas included.

Councillor Cunningham was appointed as Deputy Mayor for the remaining portion of this Council's term. Deputy Mayor Cunningham's term is in effective March 10 to October 27.

Administration identified that any new Federal funding they receive or wish to apply for will need to include consultation with the province prior to the final acceptance of the funds. This aligns with the Provincial Priorities Act & Regulations.

Council asked that Administration set up a commemoration for John King's passing.



March 24, 2025 Council Meeting Highlights

Council has a tour of the new Waskasoo Middle School on Thursday, March 27.

Council is hopeful there will be an opportunity to discuss the termination of the current agreement between the town and school board.

In addition, the school board's intentions with the old school property after the demolition of the school building.

Land Use Bylaw review and updates are underway. It is hoped that this will be ready to go before Council for 1st reading by the end of April. There are several changes being made to condense the information in the bylaw, update building requirements and provide more authority to the Development Officer.

For the month of March there have been five new single family housing permits requested. Three in the south end of town and two north of Highway #42.

Community Services continues to provide a number of programs, catered to our youth, providing a great way to connect with others. In addition, there are additional programs offered to adults/seniors such as Tech Tips and other connection workshop opportunities.

Penhold Operations Building: The operations team has been working with the contractor in finding cost-saving methods for the new build. The challenge is the tariff situation and how best to source Canadian products within a reasonable manner. More information will be presented at the next council meeting.

The town entered into an agreement with Suds Station Car Wash for a one-year term for a monthly flat fee to wash the town fleet.

2025 Tax Bill: The province moved forward with its **Education Tax** to become 1/3 of the actual provincial cost that will be reflected on property taxes. This will show a substantive increase by 14% across the province this year to move this directive forward. This will be year one of three consecutive years that will reflect school increases to bring the School Education Tax to 1/3 of the total cost onto properties.

Some good news: E-Billing is now available for taxes this year in Penhold!

Community Foundation of Central Alberta (CFCAB): In celebration of it's 35th Anniversary the CFCAB will be touring Central Alberta to connect with residents share information about the Community Foundation of Central Alberta. As the tour stops at various locations they will be presenting small grants to local organizations. Grant applications are open for community organizations to apply until April 2. The CFCAB Community Tour will be in Penhold Wednesday April 9 from 10:00-11:00 a.m. in the Club Room at the Multiplex. Anyone interested in attending can RSVP thought CFCAB website www.cfcab.ca.

Penhold & District Library: is hosting its Strategic Community meeting for their future community focuses on Tuesday April 15. If you would like more information, or are interested in attending, contact the Library to RSVP.

Frozen Catch Basins

When Spring arrives, it comes along with many puddles forming around Town.

The Operations Department does their best to minimize large puddles around Penhold but, with the temperatures dipping below zero each night it is inevitable some of the catch basins will freeze up and must be steamed daily to thaw them and get them running again.

We understand there are catch basins frozen in many areas of Town, please be patient as we work through thawing them. We give priority to those with water surrounding them having the potential to damage property.

If you come across any flooding or puddles as a result of a frozen drain, please report it to the Town by calling the office (403-886-3282) emailing info@townofpenhold.ca with the location or by submitting an E-Service Request through the Town's website (www.townofpenhold.ca)

Tips for Proper Drainage

• Create a sump pit and install a sump pump with reliable back up power; ensure pumps are operational.



- Make sure your lot is graded to aid drainage away from your home.
- Ensure sump hoses and down spouts are directed at least 6 feet away from your home's foundation.

It is illegal to have any storm drainage discharged directly into the sewer system, check sump pumps for illegal connections. If they exist, have them removed immediately as the extra flow can overload the sewer system and create sewer backups in your house. Having this water enter into our sanitary is what factors into increasing utility rates as we are charged per cubic meter for treatment of our sewer.

Street Sweeping

The Operations department does a minimum of two thorough street sweeps a year. This means that streets are signed for no parking during the day so that the sweeper can get the entire area.

Generally, the full sweeps are completed once in the spring and again in the fall. The streets will be swept periodically throughout the Town from spring until fall in problem areas without signs being posted.

Alleys are not listed as a priority and are maintained as time permits if they become impassable.

Spring Clean-up

The Town of Penhold's Annual Spring Clean Up will be held May 23 to June 2, 2025. Garbage containers will be placed at the new Public Works Shop area along Waskasoo Ave (RR270) a half mile North of Oxford on the east side of the road. More information will be provided closer to the date.

SPLASH PARK is tentatively scheduled to open May 30, 2025.

Stay off Ice/Storm Ponds

The storm retention ponds are not measured for ice depth and with the temperatures warming up there will be water flowing into these systems. Stay off the ponds as there may be a present danger of thin ice. This is because water continuously flows beneath the ice surface making these ponds unsafe to be on. Please remember to stay off the ice in these ponds.

RV Park

Penhold RV Park will open on May 3,2025. Bookings are now being accepted for the 2025 season. See the Town website to reserve your site using Camp Spot.

Yard Waste Compost

Weather permitting, yard waste compost bins will be available to use in April. The yard waste compost bins will be located at the new Public Services Building area along Waskasoo Ave (RR270) a half mile North of Oxford on the east side of the road. Check with the Town website for updates.

Accepted Items Are:

Grass clipping Leaves

Branches (no longer than 4 feet or 1 inch in diameter)

Items not accepted:

No bags includes paper and compostable bags!) No garbage

No animal feces are permitted in the bins.



Just because the package says "flushable" doesn't mean it's true. Many items marketed as disposable and/or flushable do not degrade like toilet paper, and they wind up clogging pipes, tangling pumps, and causing sewer backups into streets, businesses, and homes.

Our sewers are designed to dispose of very specific things. Using your toilet for disposal of many modern products will often result in blockages. The drains that connect your home to the main sewer are only big enough to carry water, toilet paper and human waste – pipes are typically 4 inches.

Public Works Staff work in the sewers to ensure we always have free flowing wastewater disposal. Please consider them and their safety when choosing to flush or not to flush.

What not to flush:

- Diapers (cloth, disposable, "flushable")
- Facial tissues
- Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, moist wipes, etc.
- Toilet bowl scrub pads
- Swiffer's
- Napkins (paper or cloth), paper towels
- Dental floss
- Eggshells, nutshells, and coffee grounds
- Fats, oils, and greases
- Food items containing seeds and peelings

- Hair
- Sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms, or any nonorganic material
- Vitamins, medicines, or other pharmaceuticals
- Wash cloths, towels, rags (any cloth item)
- Clothing
- Sheet plastic, or plastic of any kind
- Needles or other sharp objects
- Cigarette Butts

Alberta Sheriffs SCAN unit

Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods (SCAN) is a unit of the Alberta Sheriffs that helps keep communities safe by dealing with problem properties that are being used for specific illegal activity such as:

- -drug trafficking
- -prostitution
- -child exploitation
- -gang-related crime
- -SCAN operates based on citizen complaints not complaints from the police of jurisdiction. SCAN does liaise and work with RCMP once an investigation has been opened.
- -SCAN will conduct investigations on municipal and rural properties.
- -No one can disclose your identity to any person or agency, including law enforcement and courts, without your consent.

If a property is being used for illegal activity you may notice some common signs. Seeing one of these signs doesn't always mean illegal activity is going on, but if they happen often or together, a problem may exist.

Some common signs of illegal activity include:

- -frequent visitors at all times of the day and night
- -frequent late night activity
- -extensive home security
- -residents that are rarely seen, distant or secretive
- -windows blackened or curtains always drawn
- -neglected property and yard
- -people repeatedly visiting the property who only go to the door for a short time
- -residents who regularly meet vehicles near the property for a short time
- -strange odours coming from the house or garbage
- -garbage that contains numerous bottles and containers, particularly chemical containers
- -putting garbage in a neighbour's collection area



9-volt batteries power our smoke alarms, household items and toys.

They can be found in most homes.

But these batteries can be a fire hazard if not stored safely or disposed of with care.



The problem

- 9-volt batteries can be dangerous. The positive and negative posts are close together. If a metal object touches the two posts of a 9-volt battery, it can cause a short circuit. This can make enough heat to start a fire.
- It is unsafe to store 9-volt batteries in a drawer near paper clips, coins, pens, or other batteries. Do not store common household items such as steel wool, aluminum foil, and keys near 9-volt batteries. If these items touch the two posts, there is a greater risk of a fire starting.
- Weak batteries may have enough charge to cause a fire. Some fires have started in trash when 9-volt batteries were thrown away with other metal items.

Storing 9-volt batteries

- Weep batteries in original packaging until you are ready to use them. If loose, keep the posts covered with masking, duct, or electrical tape. Prevent the posts from coming in contact with metal objects.
- Weep them someplace safe where they won't be tossed around.
-))) Store batteries standing up.
- 9-volt batteries should not be stored loose in a drawer. Do not store them in containers with other batteries.

Disposal

- 9-volt batteries should not be thrown away with trash. They can come in contact with other batteries or pieces of metal.
- 9-volt batteries can be taken to a collection site for household hazardous waste.
- To be safe, cover the positive and negative posts with masking, duct, or electrical tape before getting rid of batteries.

9-VOLT BATTERY STORAGE

Keep batteries in original packaging until you are ready to use them. If loose, keep the posts covered with masking, duct, or electrical tape. Prevent the posts from coming in contact with metal objects.





INFORMATION FOR ALL CANADIANS 😭

Goods and Services Tax (GST) Credit

Four times a year, this tax-free payment helps individuals and families with modest incomes offset all or part of the GST they pay If you have a spouse or common-law partner, just one of you can receive this credit. When you file your 2024 tax return, CRA will determine your eligibility and will advise those who are eligible to receive the credit.

Medical Expense Deductions

This credit applies to eligible expenses – from home care services, to laser eye surgery, to orthopedics and more. The amount you can claim is the total of your expenses, minus \$2,759 or 3% of the claimant's income (whichever is less). There is no limit on the amount of eligible expenses one can claim for themselves, a spouse or common-law partner or a child under 18.

Canada Carbon Rebate

This rebate is a tax-free amount. How much you receive depends on your personal living situation and will be paid quarterly as a benefit. Living in Penhold you also qualify for a 20% supplement as you are a resident of a rural community. Tick the box on page 2 of your income tax and benefit return to claim the rural supplement.

Canada Training Credit

The Canada Training Credit (CTC) is available for eligible tuition and other fees paid for courses taken in 2024 and subsequent tax years. An eligible individual can accumulate \$250 in each year toward their CTC limit, up to a maximum of \$5,000 in a lifetime, which can be accessed the following year to help cover up to half eligible tuition and fees associated with training.

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES 🥽

Child Care Expense Deductions

You can claim payments you have made to someone who has looked after your child while you either earned an income from employment, operated a business alone or as an active partner, attended school or conducted research. The limit you can claim is up to \$8,000 per child under the age of seven, up to \$5,000 for each child 7 to 16 (and for infirm children over the age of 16), and \$11,000 for any children who are eligible for the Disability Tax Credit.

Canadian Caregiver Credit

• You can claim \$2,616 under the Canada Caregiver Credit if you support a spouse, a common-law partner or a dependent with physical or mental impairment. For your spouse, common-law partner or eligible dependent over 18, you may also claim an additional amount up to a maximum of \$8,375 depending on their income.

Adoption Expense Tax Credit

This credit is a non-refundable tax credit that allows adoptive parents to claim eligible expenses relating to the completed adoption of a child, up to a maximum of \$19.066 for each child.

Canada Child Benefit

It is a tax-free monthly payment made to eligible families raising children under 18 years of age.

INFORMATION FOR SENIORS



Home Accessibility Tax Credit

• Seniors age 65+ or persons with disabilities who are eligible for the Disability Tax Credit can claim up to \$20,000 in eligible expenses incurred in relation to a renovation allowing for better mobility/functionality or reducing the risk of harm.

Pension Income Amount & Pension Income Splitting

- Eligible pension income that can be claimed on Line 31400 is \$2,000.
- Pension income splitting allows any Canadian resident who recieves a qualifying pension to allocate up to one-half of that income to a spouse (or common-law partner).

Other Senior Tax Information

- The Age Amount allows seniors 65+ to claim up to \$8,790 on line 30100 their 2024 tax return, depending on the individual's net income.
- The age limit for converting Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs) into a Registered Retirement Income Fund (RRIF) is 71.

INFORMATION FOR WORKING CANADIANS



Canada Workers Benefit

This benefit is a refundable tax credit that supplements the earnings of low and modest workers. The CWB has two parts: a basic amount and a disability supplement for those living with a disability that qualify.

Canada Employment Amount

This amount provides most employees of the public and private sector (excluding the self-employed) with help to offset the cost of work-related expenses such as home computers, uniforms and supplies. If you qualify for this amount, you can claim \$1,433.

 Educator School Supply Tax Credit
 Eligible educators can claim a tax credit on up to \$1,000 of supply purchases per year on eligible materials purchased for their classrooms.

 Volunteer Firefighters' and Search and Rescue Tax Credits
 This is a tax credit based on an amount of \$6,000 for volunteer firefighters who perform at least 200 hours of service per year. The option to claim the exempt amount of up to \$1,000 for honorarium will remain in lieu of the credit, if eligble.

Tradespersons' Tools Deduction

This tax deduction is for tools that tradespeople have paid for out of pocket to the lesser of \$1000 or the formula used on the CRA website.

 Meal Expenses of Long-Haul Truck Drivers
 Meal and beverage expenses of long-haul truck drivers are deductible at a higher rate than 50% permitted for other transportation employees. During eligible travel periods of 2027 2024, meal and beverage expenses are deductibile at 80%.

Home Office Expenses

• Eligible employees who worked from home in 2024 are required to use the detailed method to claim home office expenses. Eligibility what is covered and how to calculate expenses can be found on the CRA website.

INFORMATION FOR HOME BUYERS *****



Home Buyers' Amount & Buyers' Plan

- The credit allows first-time home buyers to claim an amount of \$10,000 on qualifying homes purchased. It's also available to those who are not first-time home buyers but are eligible for the Disability Tax Credit when they purchase a more accessible or functional home.
- The amount first time home buyers can withdraw from their RRSP for a down payment on their first home is \$60,000 or less.






