COUNCIL CORNER

Council Highlights June 9, 2025 Meeting

CAO Report:

Real Time Tracking Systems: Several Council representatives and CAO went on a tour with Staff Sergeant Ihme from Innisfail RCMP to Edmonton to see how Real Time tracking is working for Alberta RCMP. This system is fairly new and is considered the most advanced system working in Canada. Very interesting to see how they can monitor where their officers are, as well as have the ability to track desirables.

Multiplex:

- LiveBarn continues to bring in revenue with minimal work required.
- Fitness classes are continuing throughout the summer.

Operations:

- Utility accounts for e-billing is now at 44%.
- Proform has now completed the 2025 concrete work
- Staff are out doing the mowing, weed whacking, planting, and cleaning of shrub beds.
- Lincoln Street Rec Centre (Rink Shelter) has a new look; great job by our staff
- Commons parking area is now constructed and ready for use
- RV Park opened in May with 189 bookings in May alone; the season is looking great!
- OH&S randomly selected Penhold for an inspection. The Inspector visited numerous facilities & departments. Some minor recommendations were made. The Safety Committee has done an outstanding job ensuring we are prepared.

Request for Decisions:

- A new Staff Compensation and Benefits Review was completed and approved by Council. This new grid will take effect starting this September. Staff to be advised prior to September on the changes.
- Strategic and Economic Development Planning documents were reviewed for the final time by this Council group. Majority of the identified priorities have been completed or are near completion.

Correspondence:

- Letter of appreciation was sent from Athabasca County to Mayor Yargeau thanking Penhold for the fire support sent. Kudo's to our volunteer fire fighters!
- Innisfail Legion requested a letter of support for bidding on the Dominion Darts Tournament in 2027.

Council Highlights June 23, 2025 Meeting

Public Hearing: Land Use Bylaw (LUB) 837/2025: Development Authority, Rick Binnendyk updated Council on the results from the Open House and recommendations made by the public consultation. Council tabled the LUB to permit the recommended changes.

Presentation:

Kimberly Gauthier presented her concerns to Council regarding a near miss incident involving a grade 4 class at HWY 2A and Hawkrigde Blvd.



Requesting that the town lead the way in pushing Alberta Transportation for changes to make crossing Highway 2A safer. A further request was made to look at safety prevention for the Highway 42 and Waskasoo Ave with the new school build.

CAO: PLEASE REMEMBER: taxes are due June 30.

Community Services:

- Programing for all ages continues. Check out opportunities to connect. Check out the town's website.
- Canada Day celebrations July 1 at Lincoln Street Rec Centre.
- Impact comment made from young person on a PYC field trip validates the importance of FCSS funding in the community.
- Programs continue through summer so be sure to check out what's happening in town.

Fire & Protective Services:

- Please keep your dogs on leash; there is zero tolerance for unleashed dogs.
- Penhold Fire Cadet Scholarship awards will be held on June 25.
- Fire Association was successful in obtaining granting for new bunker gear in the amount of \$53,991. We appreciate the Associations efforts.
- Helped with a charity check stop for the proposed Dog Park. The check-stop was a great success in connecting and raising funds. Approx. \$4,000 was raised over the day.
- NEW BUILDING: Development on the site is moving forward with compaction and services to site.

Administration:

- Penhold is entering into an agreement with a new assessment team as of July 1st, 2025. Our new assessment group will be Wild Rose Assessment Services.
- A special thank you to Bow Valley (Frank Watson) for all his years of service to Penhold. 29 years of great success. Thank you, Frank.
- The following Summer Council meetings have been cancelled: July 28 & August 25
- The October 14 Council meeting will also be cancelled as it is one week prior to the Oct. 20 Municipal Election.

Bylaws:

- Second reading of Bylaw 837/2025 being the Land Use Bylaw, was tabled to incorporate recommendations and suggestions made by residents and developers at the Open House held on June 11.
- Municipal Development Plan Bylaw was approved for final reading.

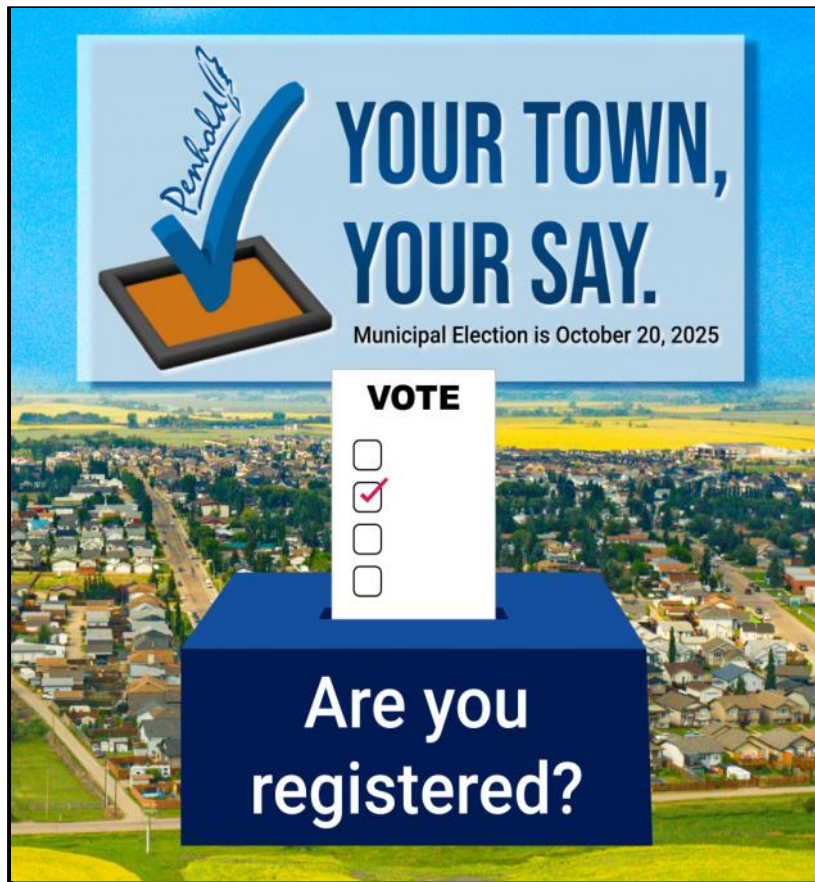

Registering early makes the voting process faster and easier, because you won't have to register at the polling station on Election Day.

Your privacy is important. VoterLink is a provincial registration system, and your information will be shared with your municipality for electoral purposes only.

The Splash Park is now open for the season!
Operating Hours 11:00 a.m. -7:00 p.m. daily.
The Lincoln Street Rec Centre building will be open for bathroom use during the operating hours of the park.

Splash Park Rules:

- The Splash Park is an unsupervised area.
- Parents / Caregivers: Do not leave children unattended!
- No abusive language or objectionable behaviour.
- No littering, please use garbage cans.
- No pets allowed; leashed, or unleashed.
- No wheeled items (bicycles, strollers, skateboards, scooters) should be on Splash Pad.
- Washrooms are inside the Rec Centre.

The Splash Park attendant is on site for Splash Park operations, not supervision.

Please be considerate when using the Splash Park as this is a re-circulating water system & all water that goes down the drain must be treated.

Unwanted substances can cause difficulties with the treatment system

resulting in shutdowns. If the system is down, it is generally due to an unbalance in the chemical treatment system or clogged filters. Please be patient with the attendant while they try to rectify the problem.



Splash Park Water Notice

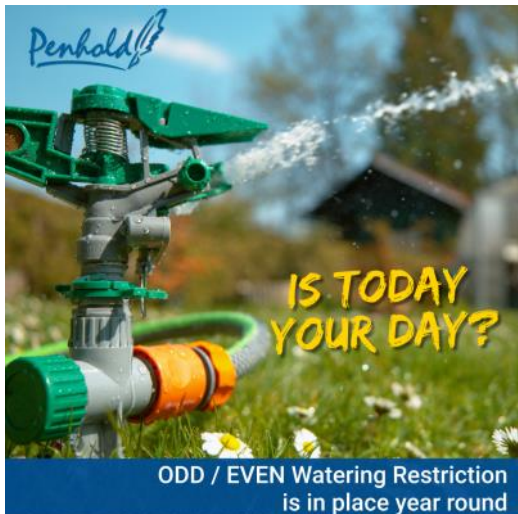
The water in this splash park is treated and recirculated to help conserve resources

Outdoor Sprinkling Restrictions In Effect Year Round



The Town of Penhold has an odd / even water restriction in effect at all times. Residents are reminded to comply with the Utility Bylaw as applicable to outdoor watering restrictions. The Utility Bylaw 833.2024 indicates: Outdoor sprinkling restrictions shall be in effect at all times.

Odd/Even Street addresses determines which days sprinkling will be allowed. The numerical address of which (excluding street name) ends in odd number may water on each odd day of the month, and the numerical address of which (excluding street name) ending in an even number may water each even day of the month.

Outdoor sprinkling includes vehicle washing, lawn watering or other irrigation purposes on any day of the month.

Tips on Conserving Water

- Choose shrubs and groundcovers instead of turf for hard-to-water areas such as steep slopes and isolated strips.
- If water runs off your lawn easily, split your water time into shorter periods to allow for better absorption.
- We are more likely to notice leaks indoors, but don't forget to check outdoor faucets, sprinklers, and hoses for leaks.
- Use sprinklers for large areas of grass. Water small patches by hand to avoid waste.
- Collect water from your roof to water your garden.

Water bans may be implemented if necessary.

Yard Waste Compost

The yard waste compost bins are open, they are located at the future Operations Shop / Fire Hall area along Waskasoo Ave (RR280) a half mile North of Oxford on the east side of the road.

Operations staff have noticed many unacceptable items in the bins from black garbage bags and mulch to household waste and significantly larger than 1" in diameter tree limbs. The contractor will not accept the bins when they have non-approved items.

Please remember to follow the signs, one bin is for grass clippings and leaves, the other is for branches less than 1" in diameter and less than 4' in length.



Dumping of non-acceptable items / misuse of the yard waste bins could result discontinuation of this service.

Yard Waste Bin Reminders:

- 1.) NO DUMPING OF HOUSEHOLD ITEMS OR GARBAGE (this includes sod and plastic garbage bags).
- 2.) Load yard waste containers from the back to the front, don't just dump your yard waste at the opening.
- 3.) Grass clippings and leaves only in the compost bin (NO SOD, NO BAGS, NO ANIMAL FECES).
- 4.) Branches less than 1" diameter & shorter than 4' in length in branch bin (NO STUMPS, FIREWOOD, LUMBER ETC).

SOCCER/BALL DIAMONDS

The soccer field and ball diamonds are ready for the 2025 season. If you are looking to book these facilities, please contact the Town Office to ensure availability.

Friendly Reminder: Dogs are not permitted in sports fields or on playgrounds. Unleashed dogs are not permitted anywhere in the Community Hub or on Town's trail systems. Help keep our town clean and pick up after your pet. There are dog poop baggie stations located around the Community Hub and Critter's Corner green spaces.

Maintenance of Boulevards and Alley Ways



Residents that have grass boulevards adjacent to their properties are responsible for maintaining the area which includes edging of the grass along the sidewalk. The Town will look after any trees planted in the boulevards.

Residents with a back alley are responsible to maintain the alley grass behind their fence, prune all trees or shrubs that interfere with any public utility or public works, traffic control devices or curb sight lines, that are/or could be a public safety hazard, including lines, poles, conduits, pipes, sewer, or other works of the Town of Penhold or utility company on their premise or property.

Gopher Control

It's getting to be that time of year again...the gophers are popping up all over Town. Moles & gophers can damage your lawn and garden. You can help control them humanely by eliminating their food source, spraying with liquid repellents, scattering repellent granules, using barriers and/or digging trenches lined with wire mesh or hardware cloth.

RV Sani Dump

RV Sani Dump is open for the season. Discount tokens for residents can be purchased through the Town Office for \$5 / token. Proof of residency is required. Tampering of the device is a fineable offence.

Penhold RV Park

Penhold RV Park will be opening for the season May 2 - October 13, 2025.

Summer Rainstorms

During storms and/or flooding it is important for residents to keep in mind, Operations priority is our Town's water and wastewater systems. The Town of Penhold's Operations Department is mandated by Alberta Environment during an emergency to, first and foremost, protect life and health.

We will do our best to get to your problem as soon as possible after all major threats have been dealt with. As much as a basement flooding may seem like an emergency, it will come second to the reservoir/water system and Lift Stations/sewer system.

Tips for Proper Drainage

- Create a sump pit and install a sump pump with reliable back up power; ensure pumps are operational.
- Make sure your lot is graded to aid drainage away from your home.
- Ensure sump hoses and down spouts are directed at least 6 feet away from your home's foundation.

*****It is illegal to have any storm drainage discharging directly into the sewer system, check sump pumps for illegal connections. If they exist have them removed immediately as the extra flow can overload the sewer system and create sewer backups in your house. *****



Last fall, the Operations team installed the first phase of Penhold's Disc Golf. Work is continuing this summer with completion of the final phase expected to be complete by mid-August.

Hayter Park:

There are three (3) practise baskets set up at Hayter Park for new players to learn the game or practise their skills.

Critters Corner:

The first of Penhold's two (2) nine hole Disc Golf Courses is ready for use at Critter's Corner. These holes are geared to intermediate level players.

Penhold Commons:

Over the coming weeks, Operations will be working on installing the final 9 hole course starting around the Penhold Commons storm pond, meandering around the ball diamonds over to the Lucina storm pond and finish at the concrete block beside the Multi-Use All-Wheel Park (MAP) for a photo shoot.

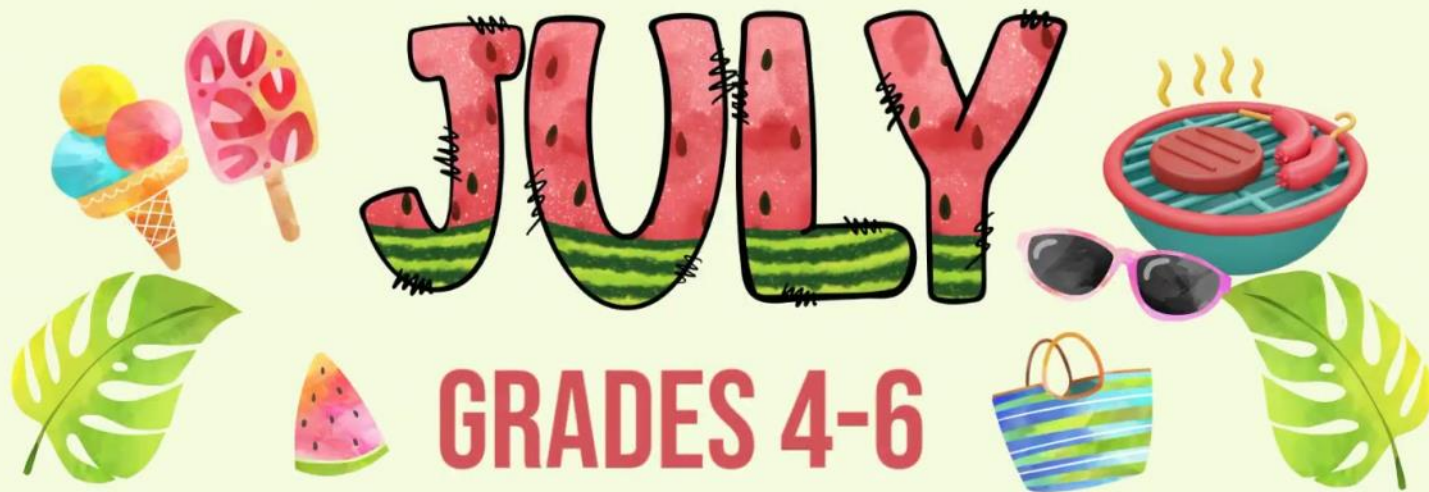

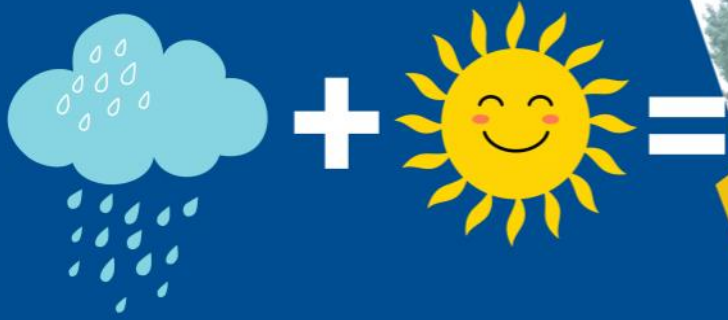
