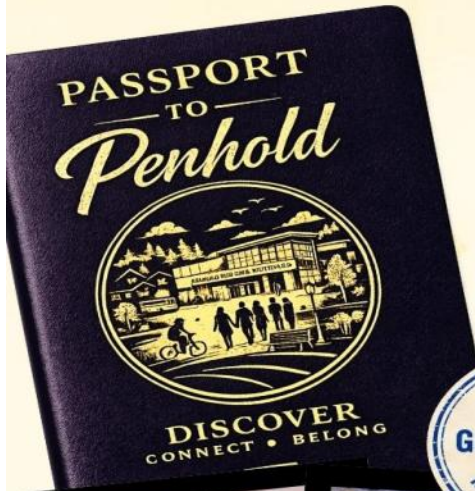

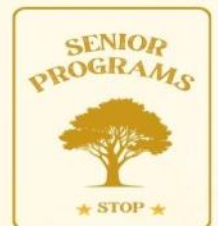

COUNCIL CORNER

Key Notes From July 27, 2026 Council Meeting

CAO Report

Fire Hall sale is fully complete as of the end of June. The new owner is in renovation mode. Trees have been trimmed and some removed. Thank you to Sean and team.

Chinook's Edge is making ready to move in four (4) portable units at Jessie Duncan School. This will double the number of current portables in place. Portables are to be ready for this September.

The old Penhold School has been fully boarded up; timing of next steps in demolition process still not confirmed.

Council has a brief connection meeting with Minister Williams, Municipal Affairs on July 30th.

ICF meeting with Red Deer County is scheduled for August 12th – Penhold is hosting.

Development at mid-year for housing starts - last year at this time we had nine (9) housing starts, this year we are currently at 19.

Melcor has signed off on the development agreement and made compensation. Construction work on the 36 lots has begun. They hope for some housing starts this fall.

The park and soccer pitch area north of Oxford Blvd will be developed in conjunction with the subdivision.

Community Services

Fundraising success stories occurring, with the Pancake Breakfast and United Way funding for four (4) years. Great work FCSS team.

Working with Salvation Army connecting to our community for food hamper and meal program is positive.

Youth Club attendance and activities through the summer is so good.

Fire Department

Great to see that our department is at stand, ready and willing for possible deployment.

Looking forward to the grand opening of the new Public Service Building.

Multiplex

Interesting stat on volume of water used when making ice - 57,000 litres. Stay tuned for a video of the process.

Operations

48% of utility bills are done by e-billing.

Assisted Waskasoo Middle School with the installation of funnel ball poles.

Dust control has been applied in certain areas around town.

Playground equipment was inspected and some minor repairs were done.

Lots of landscaping occurred for regular maintenance throughout town.

RV Park continues to see high level usage; great to see. On average, 48% of the park is booked.

Upcoming: Storm Line along Minto Street; and road repairs from underground work.

New Business

Golf Cart report: Council referred this back to administration requesting additional information on other municipalities to possibly allow golf carts to be used within the town.

Sister City Program: Council received information for future considerations. Should a councillor find a community that we should consider further it may be brought back.

Deputy Mayor: Councillor Denson was sworn-in and will serve as Deputy Mayor until February 2027.

Appointments: Alisha Benedict; Brandi Filipchuk and Cystal Schening have been appointed to the Library Board to 2029. Congrats to this committed team.

ByLaws: Council approved 2nd and 3rd reading of Bylaw 849/2026 Subdivision and Development Appeal Board which will have Red Deer County provide subdivision and development appeal board for challenges in future.

Council Round Table

Council requested that administration place an article in the August Reporter on the dangers of Fox Tail weeds for pets and wildlife.

Other Items: A special thank you to United Way for committing four years of funding to the Penhold Youth Club. So appreciated.

A Collaborative Approach to Growth Planning

Town of Penhold, Town of Bentley, and Village of Clive Come Together to Plan for Future Growth

The Towns of Bentley and Penhold, along with the Village of Clive, are working together to develop a Shared Regional Growth Strategic Framework.

This partnership is supported through an Alberta Community Partnership grant and will help each community plan for growth in a way that reflects their unique needs. The process will support collaboration, shared learning, and stronger local capacity.

In addition to local analysis and strategies for each community, the project will create a framework that can be shared with other municipalities looking for a practical and strategic approach to planning for growth.

A customized growth strategy will be developed for each community, incorporating several key components. This strategy will include a comprehensive review of existing plans policies, and regulations to assess the community's readiness for development.

As part of the project, detailed community profiles and housing needs assessments will be created for each municipality. The housing needs assessments will use demographic information and housing trends to ensure that planning in each community reflects current and future housing demand.

The project will result in clear, local roadmaps with recommendations and actions for each community, along with a regional framework that others can use as a model.

"We're very excited for this opportunity to work in partnership with our neighbours in Bentley and Clive. As Penhold continues to experience growth, we need to be able to strategically plan for it to ensure we continue to be an attractive place to live and remain an affordable, young vibrant community," said Mike Yargeau, Town of Penhold Mayor.

A key component of the project will be engaging members of each municipality to gather community insights around what growth and development mean to them. By involving the community members, including youth, participants will gain a clearer understanding of how growth and development contribute to the overall health and well-being of the community.

Yard Waste Compost Bins

The Yard Waste Compost is now open for the season! It is scheduled to be open until the end of October, weather dependant.

The bins are located at the Northwest entrance of the Public Services Building located at 101 Waskasoo Ave (a half mile North of Oxford Blvd, east side of the road).

Accepted items in their designated bins include:

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Branches (no longer than 4 feet or 1 inch in diameter)
- No bags, garbage or animal feces are permitted in the bins.

Please be considerate, removing bags after they are in the bins is labour intensive. Please don't add to already full bins, they get checked and emptied on a regular basis. This is a great service to have, please help us keep it available!



Splash Park

The Splash Park Operating Hours are 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Daily.



The Lincoln Street Rec Centre building will be open for bathroom use during the operating hours of the park.

Splash Park Rules:

- Unsupervised area
- Parents do not leave children unattended
- No abusive language or objectionable behaviour
- No littering, please use garbage cans
- No pets allowed, leashed, or unleashed
- No wheeled items (bicycles, strollers, skateboards, scooter) should be on Splash Pad
- Washrooms are in the Rec Centre building

The Splash Park attendant is on site for Splash Park operations not supervision.

Please be considerate when using the Splash Park as this is a re-circulating water system and all water that goes down the drain must be treated. Unwanted substances can cause difficulties with the treatment system resulting in shutdowns. If the system is down, it is generally due to an unbalance in the chemical treatment system or clogged filters. If you notice a concern with the Splash Park system, please call 403-352-9352.

Please be patient with the attendant while they try to rectify the problem.



ODD / EVEN Watering Restriction is year round in Penhold

A reminder to comply with the Utility Bylaw as applicable to outdoor watering restrictions.

The Utility Bylaw 841/2026 indicates: Outdoor sprinkling restrictions shall be in effect at all times. Odd/Even Street addresses determines which days sprinkling will be allowed. The numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an odd number may water on each odd day, and the numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an even number may water each even day of the month. Outdoor sprinkling includes vehicle washing, lawn watering or other irrigation purposes on any day of the month.

Some tips to help you conserve water are:

- Set your sprinkler to avoid watering patios, driveways, and sidewalks.
- Water back from the tops of slopes, as water will run down the slope and seep into the soil.
- Sweep your driveway and walkway instead of washing with a hose.
- Apply a maximum of 2.5cm (1 in) of water, including rainfall, to your lawn each week.

Pets in Greenspaces

The Town's greenspaces, playgrounds and Sport fields are multi-use areas, dogs are not permitted unleashed in these areas.

Please be respectful of others and pick up your dog's waste so everyone can enjoy our great spaces.

Sani-Dump Station

The fees for the Penhold RV sanitary dumping station are as follows:

- \$10.00 per token for non-residents
- \$5.00 per token for residents
- Tokens can be purchased at the Town Office during regular business hours (Monday to Friday 8am-4:30pm excluding stat holidays. Closed for lunch between 12:00-12:30pm)

Please note: Without tokens, cost for ALL users is \$10.00. Credit card payment required.

Just because the package says "flushable" doesn't mean it's true. Many items marketed as disposable and/or flushable do not degrade like toilet paper, and they wind up clogging pipes, tangling pumps, and causing sewer backups into streets, businesses, and homes.

Our sewers are designed to dispose of very specific things. Using your toilet for disposal of many modern products will often result in blockages. The drains that connect your home to the main sewer are only big enough to carry water, toilet paper and human waste – pipes are typically 4 inches.

Operations Staff work in the sewers to ensure we always have free flowing wastewater disposal. Please consider them and their safety when choosing to flush or not to flush.

What not to flush:

- Diapers (cloth, disposable, "flushable")
- Facial tissues
- Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, moist wipes, etc.
- Toilet bowl scrub pads
- Swiffer's
- Napkins (paper or cloth), paper towels
- Dental floss
- Egg shells, nutshells, and coffee grounds
- Fats, oils, and greases
- Food items containing seeds and peelings
- Hair
- Sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms, or any non-organic material
- Vitamins, medicines, or other pharmaceuticals
- Wash cloths, towels, rags (any cloth item)
- Clothing
- Sheet plastic, or plastic of any kind
- Needles or other sharp objects
- Cigarette Butts

If it isn't human waste or toilet paper – please don't flush it!

Help Protect Pets & Wildlife by Removing Foxtail Grass

Foxtail grass is becoming a concern in our community because its sharp, barbed seed heads can attach to pets and wildlife, becoming lodged in their paws, ears, noses, eyes, or skin. This can cause painful injuries and may require veterinary care.



Residents are encouraged to check their properties and remove foxtail before it goes to seed. The plant typically grows 1–3 feet tall and is recognized by its fuzzy, bristly seed head that resembles a fox's tail. As it matures, the seed head changes from green or purple-tinged to a light tan colour.

When removing foxtail, wear gloves and protective clothing, pull or dig out the entire plant where possible, and place it in a sealed garbage bag for disposal. Do not compost foxtail, as the seeds can continue to spread.

A few minutes spent removing foxtail can help create a safer environment for pets, wildlife, and the entire community.



Protect Your Pets From Foxtail Injuries

Foxtail seeds can:

- Become lodged in paws, causing swelling, limping, and infection.
- Enter the ears, leading to pain and head shaking.
- Be inhaled through the nose, causing persistent sneezing and irritation.
- Become trapped in the eyes, resulting in redness, discharge, and injury.
- Pierce the skin and migrate deeper into the body if left untreated.

After spending time in tall grass, check your pet's paws, ears, eyes, and coat for foxtails. If your pet is limping, persistently sneezing, shaking its head, or has unexplained swelling, contact your veterinarian promptly.

Love 'em & Leash 'em!

There is no off-leash area within Penhold, please keep pets on a leash at all times. By keeping your pet on a leash you can:

- 🐾 Keep dogs safe & parks clean
- 🐾 Prevent bites & fights
- 🐾 Reduce stress for everyone

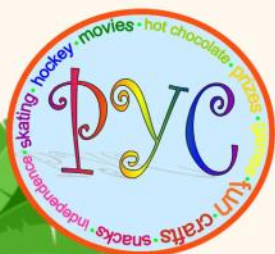

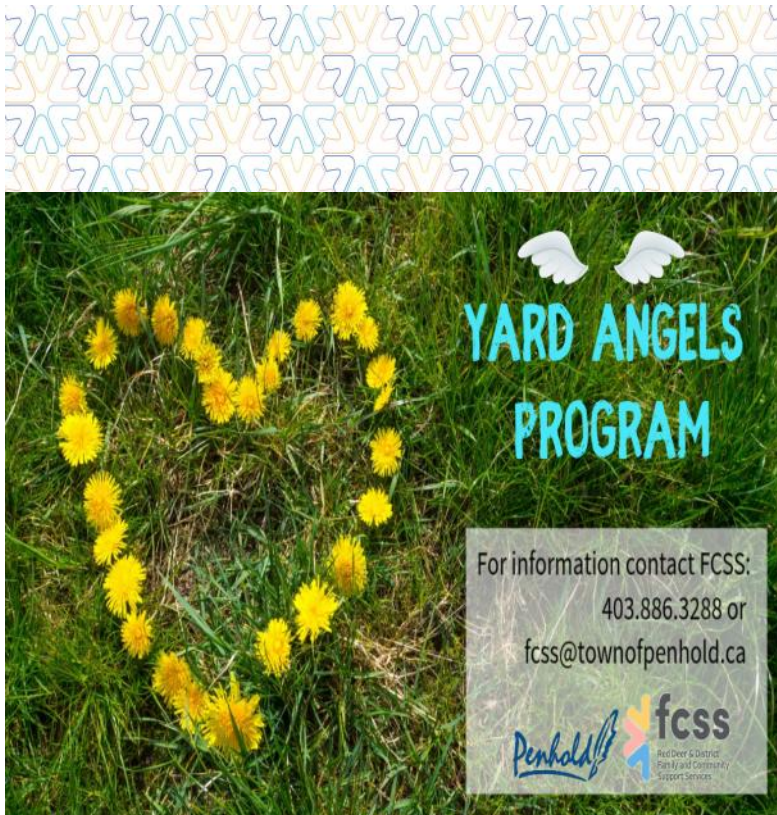

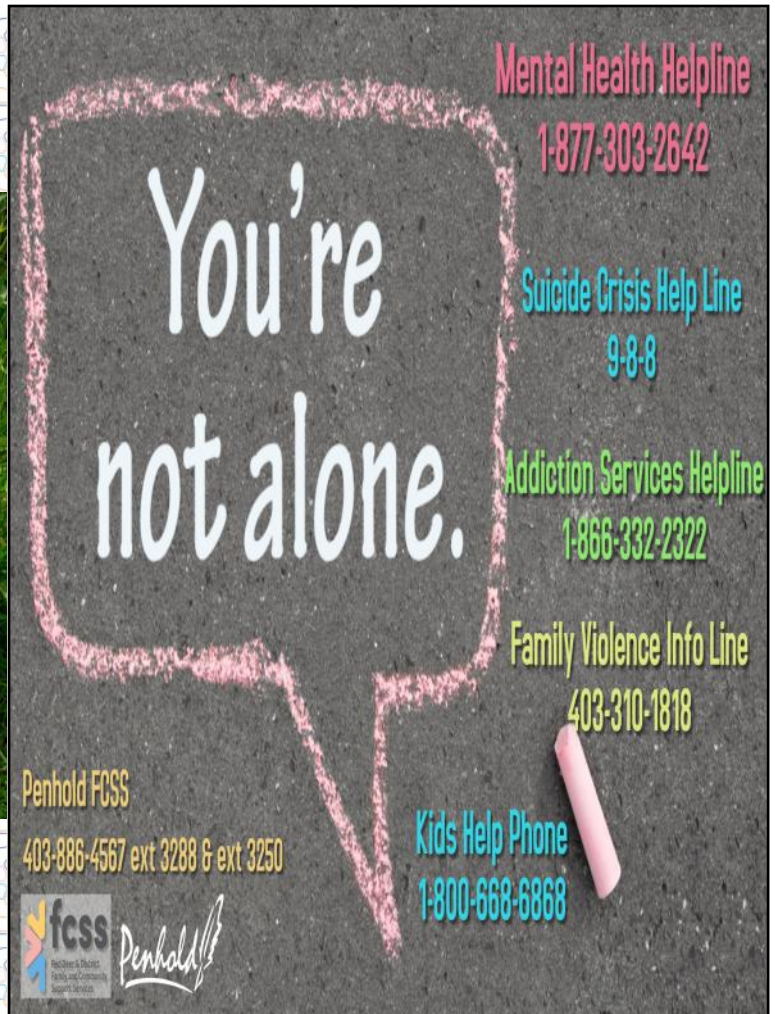

How Well Can Your Child See?

Your Optometrist Knows the Answer!

Eye See...Eye Learn!™

is a program that ensures children starting kindergarten have the vision they need. The Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan (AHCIP) provides partial coverage towards an annual eye exam for children under the age of 19. If required, kindergarten-aged students can also receive a free pair of eyeglasses through the Eye See...Eye Learn™ program.

Alberta Association of Optometrists

How kindergarten-aged students participate

STEP 1

Parents can find a participating optometrist at optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and check the box for Eye See...Eye Learn™, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. Call or go online to book an appointment.

STEP 2

See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready. Through Alberta Health Care, there is partial coverage towards your child's annual eye exam up to the age of 19.

STEP 3

If required, kindergarten-aged students will receive a free pair of eyeglasses. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

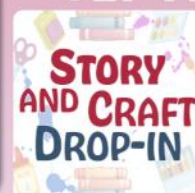
