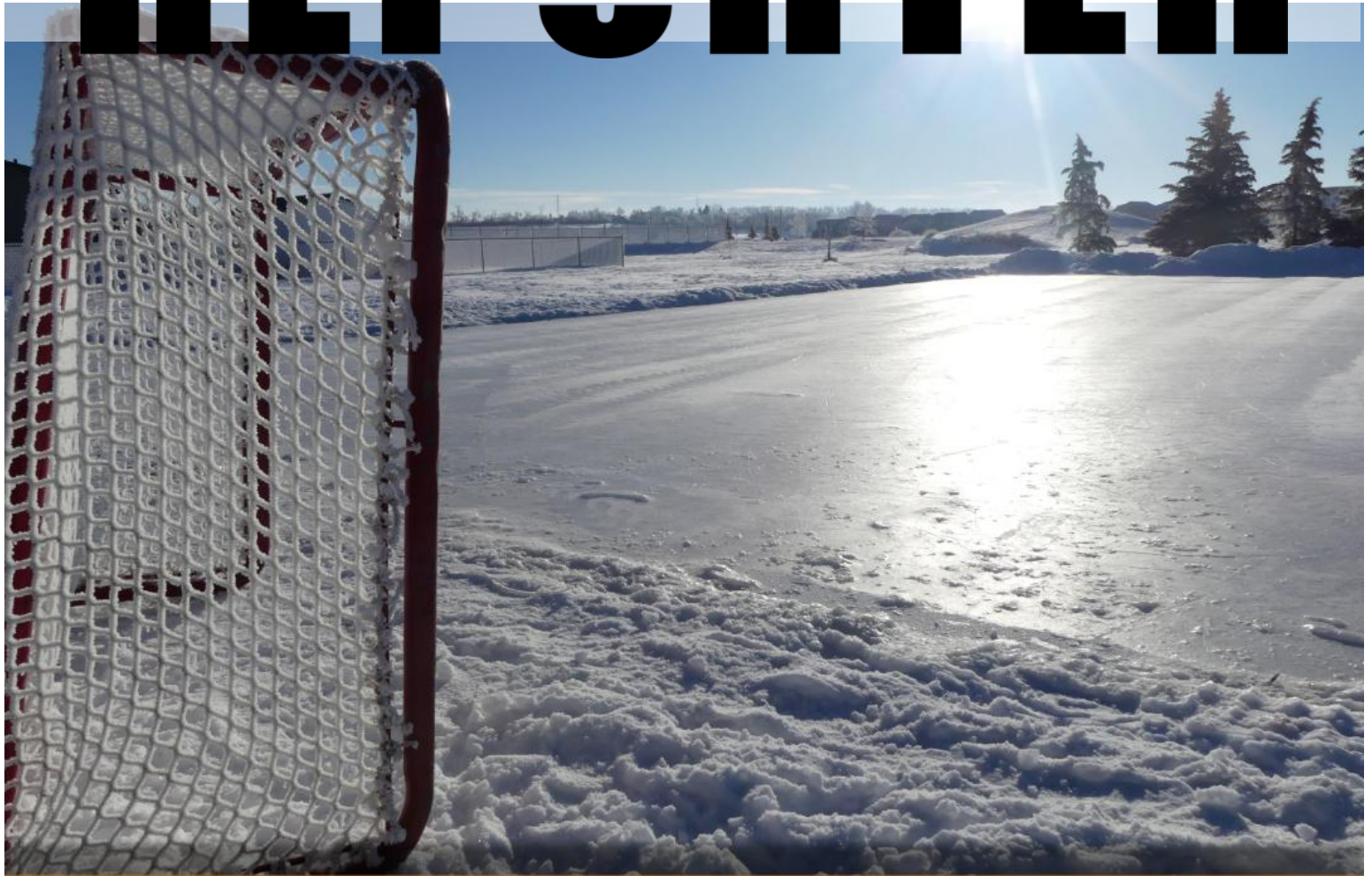

COUNCIL CORNER

December 15, 2025 Regular Council Meeting Update

2026 Operational Budget has been approved.

Corporate Services Manager, Tricia Willis, walked Council through the operating budget and reductions that have been made to bring in a balanced operating budget. This will be revisited once the requisitions come in approx. Mar/Apr. Requisition from the various Provincial government areas represent 28% of the total tax base.

The Town will also be finalizing the long-term debt for the town's operations building which will all be worked into the final calculations prior to setting next year's tax rates.

Reports:

CAO:

- Staff have been asked to work with the RCMP to host another community discussion session in 2026, with a scheduled date of Tuesday Feb 10, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. More information to follow.
- Penhold Memorial Hall review will be brought to Council Jan. 12, 2026 for discussion and direction.

Fire & Protective Services:

- Emergency Management training in Innisfail Jan 21, 2026 for elected officials.
- Reduced pet license fee will expire as of Dec. 31, 2025.
- Work on the new Public Services Building continues with concrete flooring going in now, and the rooms will be developed within the next month.

Multiplex:

- In the month of November 22,653 customers came into the building.
- Solar had estimated \$716 in savings

Operations:

- Had a pipe burst done across 2A at Lucina Street for sewer. There was no disruption while doing this work.
- Utilities have been reviewed with a minor change in rates to move towards the cost recovery realms.

New Business:

There were several utility accounts written off due to non-recovery of funds and owners have moved out of this area. This is clearing old accounts up.

Correspondence:

Linda Briggs was acknowledged for her commitment to Penhold by the Minister of Assisted Living and Social Services.

2026 Business Licensing Reminder

Business License renewals are now due. If you have not received your renewal notice, or your business is no longer active, please contact us by emailing info@townofpenhold.ca.

Payment for the 2026 Business License renewals must be processed prior to **January 31**. Businesses not renewing by the due date will incur a 15% Penalty Fee on February 1.

All businesses without a valid business licence will be removed from the Business Directory on the town website on February 1.

The Town of Penhold would like to remind business owners, contractors, and home-based businesses, any person(s) who perform services or advertise products within the town **must** apply for a business license.

Operating a Business Within Penhold

The Town requires all home-based, commercial, and industrial businesses to obtain a valid Business Licence under the Business Licence Bylaw. This includes all local and non-local businesses providing a service or conducting sales within the Town. A business licence provides customer assurance that your business is valid to operate within the Town. It also provides protection for local businesses that are invested in our community by creating accountability.

Operating without a valid business licence carries a fine of \$400. Some businesses are exempt under Section 2, Exemptions, of the Business Licence Bylaw 834/2025, such as non-profit organizations. For more information about the business bylaw and/or business licence fees, visit the Town website.

BUSINESS LICENCE applications can be obtained on the Town of Penhold website and credit card payments can be made using Option Pay.

SNOW SEASON REMINDERS

The Operations staff make every effort to ensure our streets are clear of snow and ice during the winter months.

Snow plowing and/or removal on streets will be started after a heavy snowfall (15cm) or once accumulations have reached 15cm.

The priority areas are as follows:

- 1** PRIORITY ONE includes main thoroughfares and bus routes.
- 2** PRIORITY TWO includes businesses, streets and avenues.
- 3** PRIORITY THREE includes Closes, Courts and Places. These are cleared once all other major areas are complete.

The Outdoor Rink (ODR) at Lincoln Street Recreation area is now open for the season.

The rink shelter and the outdoor rink are open for use 11:00 a.m. - 9:30 p.m. daily (closed for maintenance 8:30-11:00 a.m. daily).

During the week, Town of Penhold staff clear snow from the ice and flood each morning. The flooding is done by hand rather than with an ice resurfacing machine. The process takes time, please be patient and abide by operating times to allow staff adequate time to complete the work and keep the ice the best it can be for everyone's enjoyment. The rink is flooded on weekdays and is not flooded on the weekends, shovels are available for users to clear snow from the rink when needed.

Storm Ponds Are Not Safe For Recreation

Unlike regular ponds in the rural areas, the storm retention ponds can have water flowing into these systems anytime during the winter months. For everyone's safety, please, stay off the ice as there is the danger of thin ice.

Storm ponds are working facilities that are unsafe for **ALL** forms of winter recreation including sledding, skating, hockey, cross-country skiing, and walking. Stay off the ice, there may be a present danger of thin ice, people and pets can, and have, fallen through the ice.

Water is diverted into a retention pond by a network of underground pipes connecting the storm drains to the pond. This system allows large amounts of water to enter the pond, and the outlet lets out small amounts of water as required.

This movement of water creates ice that can appear thick at the top but is thin within the area the water is flowing underneath. The Operations staff do not measure ponds for ice depth throughout the winter as these depths can fluctuate throughout the whole pond surface.

Did you know?

- Storm retention ponds are typically warmer and more turbulent than natural bodies of water, resulting in faster melting of ice.
- The water contains road salt due to 'run off' from roads, parking lots and sidewalks. This salt also contributes to faster melting ice.
- Storm ponds retain groundwater year-round. Water below the surface is constantly moving, which means it does not freeze as evenly as natural bodies of water.

These storm retention ponds include Palisades, Lucina Street, behind the Multiplex / school, Community Hub pond, Lift Station 1 (Waskasoo Lift Station) and east of the roundabout by Fas Gas.



Community Hub Storm Retention Pond Safety

The Community Hub Pond Aeration system runs year-round and assists with the natural oxygenation process of the water body to help combat harsh winter conditions. This will result in open water throughout the winter and thin ice.

Signs have been placed in the area, stay off this pond as well as all other storm ponds throughout town as water may be flowing underneath the surface and the ice levels are not monitored.

Lincoln Street Storm Pond

The Lincoln Street Storm Pond is a designated and licensed snow dumping site for the Operations Department and is not meant for recreational use. Trucks and equipment are using the site while snow removal is in progress. Please avoid using the area during this time.



Snow Removal Now Underway

The Operations staff will make every attempt to put out No Parking signs the day before planned street sweeping or snow removal. NO PARKING signs are placed out prior to 4:30 p.m. the day before maintenance begins.

There is no parking on the road during the hours posted until the signs are removed. Vehicles are considered towable if they are not in accordance with the posted street sign (Traffic Bylaw 828/2024 Section 4.12). If the Operations crew is not able to complete street sweeping/snow removal on the day planned, the signs will remain up until removal is completed.

Our Operations team make every effort to ensure that our streets are clear of snow and ice during the winter months. Please be patient as we complete this process. Snow plowing and/or removal on streets will be started after a heavy snowfall (15cm) or once accumulations have reached 15 cm. The snow removal priority map is available on the Town website.

The priority areas are as follow:

- **Priority one** includes main thoroughfares and bus routes.
- **Priority two** includes businesses, streets, and avenues.
- **Priority three** are Closes, Courts, and Places – these are cleared once all other major areas are complete.

If you are unsure when snow removal is taking place, please call the Operations department at 403-886-3282. You can also receive updates buy email by signing up for E-News through the Town of Penhold website.

Alleys are not listed as a priority and are maintained as time and conditions permit.

This process may take three weeks or longer depending on snow fall, conditions, and workload. Should another 15cm of snow accumulate during the snow removal process, priorities will shift back to one and two.

Snow will be windrowed until removal is possible. Where applicable, snow will be windrowed to the side of the street without a sidewalk.

Please use extra care when approaching snow removal equipment as visibility is limited and equipment may stop and/or back up suddenly.



Reminder to consider neighbours and delivery people by clearing your sidewalks. Snow must be removed within 72 hours of any snowfall.

Residents are responsible for snow removal on all sidewalks adjacent to their home. Snow that is cleaned off sidewalks and driveways cannot be deposited onto the road. (Traffic Bylaw 828/2024 Section 22.6)

Fire Safety during Winter Storms

Winter storms can happen almost anywhere. They can cause us problems. Know what to do before, during and after a storm. This will help keep you and your family safe from a winter fire.

- Test all smoke alarms. Do this at least once a month. This way you will know they are working. Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test the alarms.
- Plan two ways out of the home in case of an emergency. Clear driveway and front walk of ice and snow. This will provide easy access to your home.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street. If you need help, firefighters will be able to find you.
- Be ready in case the power goes out. Have flashlights on hand. Also have battery-powered lighting and fresh batteries. Never use candles.
- Stay aware of winter weather. Listen to the television or radio for updates. Watch for bulletins online.
- Check on neighbors. Check on others who may need help.
- Generators should be used outdoors. Keep them away from windows and doors. Do not run a generator inside your garage, even if the door is open.
- Stay away from downed wires. Report any downed wires to authorities.
- Be ready if the heat stops working. Use extra layers of clothes and blankets to stay warm. If you use an emergency heat source, keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away.
- Turn portable heaters off when you leave the room. Turn them off when you go to bed.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

There are more home fires in winter than in any other season. Half of all home heating fires happen in December, January and February.

As you stay cozy and warm this winter season, be fire smart!

Snowmobiling Prohibited Within Town Limits




Residents are reminded that snowmobiling is not permitted within town limits, including all green spaces.

This restriction is in place to ensure safety and enjoyment of these spaces for all residents and to protect the integrity of our shared community resources.

Why snowmobiling is not allowed:

- **Legal Restrictions:** Snowmobiles are not legally permitted within Penhold town limits. Operating a snowmobile in Penhold violates Bylaw 828/2024. (Section 4.9 restricts parking and driving of any vehicle, including snowmobiles, on Town land) and may result in fines or other penalties. Additionally, the Alberta Traffic Safety Act part 6 restricts Off-Highway Vehicles from driving on any primary or secondary highway and their right of ways and also restricts the use of any vehicle (including OHV) on all roads unless they are: registered, insured, operated by a licensed operator, wearing helmets, have operating headlamps and tail lamps, have a valid licence plate.
- **Preventing Damage to Park Resources:** Snow-covered areas may conceal small trees, shrubs, grass, park furniture, and infrastructure. Snowmobiles can cause significant damage to these elements, which are vital to maintaining the beauty and functionality of our parks.

Clear your exhaust points as well as your sidewalks

Weather fluctuations and heavy snow can lead to exterior vents for gas fired appliances getting covered, blocked, or buried. This can lead to rapid buildup of Carbon Monoxide in your home.

Ensure all exhaust vents for any gas fired appliances (stoves, furnace, hot water tanks, range hoods) are free and clear of ice and snow build up.


If you notice damage to any of your vents, have them inspected by a certified technician and have them replaced.

Learn to Skate



January to March 2026

Learn to skate will strive to help participants learn the basic fundamentals of skating in a fun and safe environment with the main goal of helping your child become more comfortable and confident on the ice. Off ice activities are played to help kids gain confidence on their skates before moving to the ice surface. On ice instruction follow the same philosophy of learning through play.

Beginner Classes: These classes (bold text) are intended for children who have never skated before. All other classes listed are suitable for children who can stand up on the ice and take small steps or strides on the ice.

4 spots available per class. Classes are intended for children ages 3 to 7 who have never skated or do not have much skating experience. In the event of high demand for class spaces priority will be given to those who have never attended classes with the Town of Penhold before.
