COUNCIL CORNER

May 12 Council Meeting

Council had 2 presentations:

1.) Parkland Community Planning Services (PCPS): Vahid Ghomashchi introduced a new revised Land Use Bylaw 837/2025 to council.

Key points include:

- To bring the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) to a current development document. Last reviewed in 2018.
- Address new zoning updates.
- Show more illustrative graphics within the document for ease of use.
- Clarify unclear verbiage.
- Include updates for violations to the bylaw.
- Incorporate sections that were attachments to the bylaw.
- Address ongoing items that have been coming up through the Municipal Planning Commission.
- Allow further flexibility for the Development Authority.
- Ensure LUB aligns with corresponding municipal documents: Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) and Municipal Development Plan (MDP).

Wednesday June 11th, at 4:00 – 6:00pm, there will be an Open House in the Penhold & District Library.

Monday June 23rd, at 6:00pm, there will be a Public Hearing considering the revised Land Use Bylaw 837/2025.

Council proceeded to give 1st reading to the new Land Use Bylaw 837/2025.

2.) Melcor Developments: – Oxford Landing outline plan amendment.

Gregg Broks, Regional Manager for Melcor, presented changes to the outline plan to meet today's interest for new development.

The key focus is to update the 2019 Outline Plan to reflect current day home building within the Melcor Subdivision.

The Area that was zoned as R-5 (Manufactured Homes) is being changed to multi-family housing R3 and duplex developments R2.

Council moved that the concept be accepted and upon review from Administration that this document be brought back for possible approval.

Central Alberta Regional Assessment Review Board (RARB)

Council approved continuing with RARB membership and requested Administration to look into other possible alternatives that may be available to Penhold in light the town has never had to use this service.

Reports:

CAO Rick Binnendyk identified:

Tax and Assessment notices went out.

Multiplex: Congrats to Levie who won a free conference with scoring 100% on a course he took in 2024. Top of the class and recognized at the Alberta Association of Recreation Facility Personnel (AARFP) banquet.

Operations: Council designated May 18th - 24th National Public Works Week. Council commented on how great our community is looking. Thank you to the operations team.

Fire & Protective Services: Council approved the purchase of Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) units. It was identified that the equipment should be delivered within approx. 8 weeks.

May 26 Council Meeting

Reports:

CAO Mr. Binnendyk identified:

The draft Land Use Bylaw 837/2025 rewrite was sent to agencies with a vested interest for comment. Next steps are as follows:

- **Open House:** Wednesday June 11th, at 4:00 – 6:00pm, in the Penhold Library.

- **Public Hearing:** Monday June 23rd, at 6:00pm, in Council Chambers in conjunction with Council meeting.

Following the Public Hearing, Council may proceed to give 2nd and possible 3rd reading to the 837/2025 Land Use Bylaw 837/2025.

Community Services:

The Community Garage Sale was held on Saturday May 24th with over 50 addresses registered.

The Canada Day Celebration is being hosted at the Lincoln Street Recreation Centre on July 1st in conjunction with the PYC Pancake Breakfast. The PYC Pancake Breakfast will be open from 8:30 – 10:30 am and the Canada Day Celebration will run from 9:30 – 11:30 am.

Fire & Protective Services:

Congratulations to the six Penhold Fire Cadets who competed amongst 70 total cadets in Edmonton at the Poundmaker Fire Training Facility. This event, sponsored by ATCO, provided three competitions and one learning station along with networking and teambuilding activities. It was a highlight of the year for the cadets who performed amazingly in the Fast Attack, Ropes and Knots, and Firefit Challenge.

Council directed Administration to submit a nomination for the Alberta Municipalities 2025 Awards Dedicated Senior Team for their work on the upcoming Public Services Building.

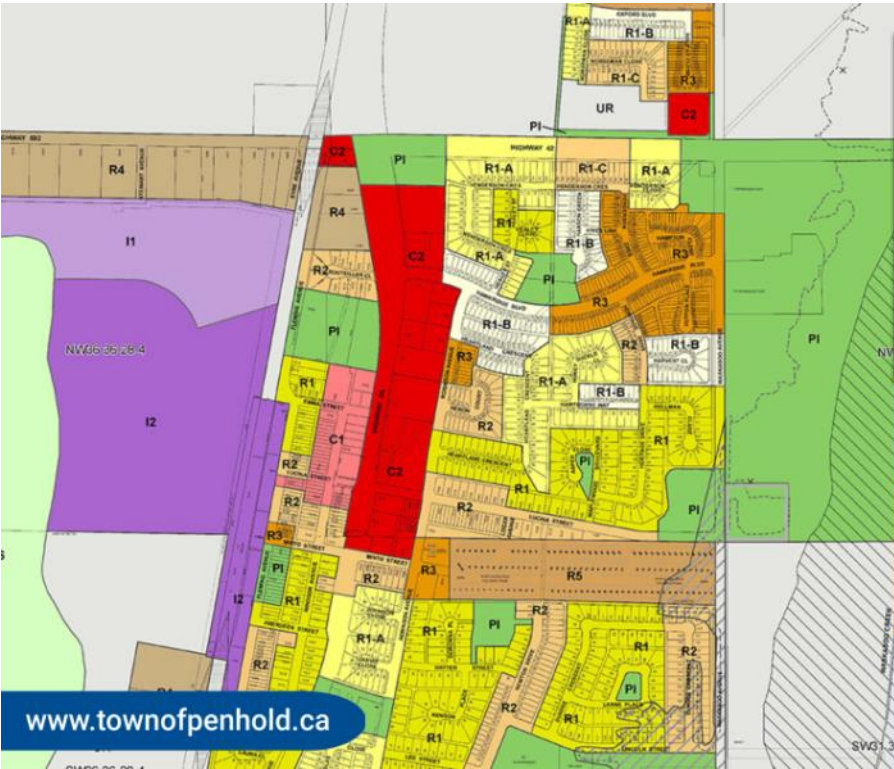

The Town of Penhold will be hosting a Public Open House to review the proposed changes of the Land Use Bylaw 837/2025. This will be a drop-in style event.

Wednesday June 11, 2025 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Penhold & District Library (Penhold Regional Multiplex - 1 Waskasoo Avenue, Penhold, AB).

The Land Use Bylaw (LUB) is a statutory planning document used in the day-to-day management of development activities within the Town of Penhold. The purpose of the LUB is to provide direction for orderly development of lands within the municipality, while ensuring the greater public interest is protected. The current Town of Penhold LUB was adopted by Council in 2011 and requires updating to address new challenges related to development, land use and subdivision.

Following the Open House, a Public Hearing will be held during the regular meeting of Penhold Town Council.

Council will consider submissions made in person, or by the agent, from any person who claims to be affected by the proposed bylaw at this time. OPERATIONS



The Splash Park is now open for the season!
Operating Hours 11:00 a.m. -7:00 p.m. daily.
The Lincoln Street Rec Centre building will be open for bathroom use during the operating hours of the park.

Splash Park Rules:

- The Splash Park is an unsupervised area.
- Parents / Caregivers: Do not leave children unattended!
- No abusive language or objectionable behaviour .
- No littering, please use garbage cans.
- No pets allowed; leashed, or unleashed.
- No wheeled items (bicycles, strollers, skateboards, scooter) should be on Splash Pad.
- Washrooms are inside the Rec Centre.

The Splash Park attendant is on site for Splash Park operations, not supervision.

Please be considerate when using the Splash Park as this is a re-circulating water system & all water that goes down the drain must be treated. Unwanted substances can cause difficulties with the treatment system resulting in shutdowns. If the system is down, it is generally due to an unbalance in the chemical treatment system or clogged filters. Please be patient with the attendant while they try to rectify the problem.



Spring Street Sweeping is now complete! THANKS to everyone who obeyed the Street Sweeping Parking signs, it makes our job so much easier.

The streets will be swept periodically throughout the Town from spring until fall in problem areas without signs being posted.

Penhold Commons Wash Rooms

The public washrooms by the gazebo will be open 9:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. daily until Thanksgiving, (weather dependent)

SOCCER/BALL DIAMONDS

The soccer field and ball diamonds are ready for the 2025 season. If you are looking to book these facilities, please contact the Town Office to ensure availability.

Friendly Reminders: Dogs are not permitted in sports fields or on playgrounds. Unleashed dogs are not permitted anywhere in the Community Hub or on Town trail systems. Help keep our town clean and pick up after your pet. There are dog poop baggie stations located around the Community Hub and Critter's Corner green spaces.

Outdoor Sprinkling Restrictions are in effect all year long



The Town of Penhold has an odd / even water restriction in effect at all times. Residents are reminded to comply with the Utility Bylaw as applicable to outdoor watering restrictions. The Utility Bylaw 833.2024 indicates: Outdoor sprinkling restrictions shall be in effect at all times.

Odd/Even Street addresses determines which days sprinkling will be allowed. The numerical address of which (excluding street name) ends in odd number may water on each odd day of the month, and the numerical address of which (excluding street name) ending in an even number may water each even day of the month. Outdoor sprinkling includes vehicle washing, lawn watering or other irrigation purposes on any day of the month.

Yard Waste Compost

IMPORTANT NOTE: Bins will be closed June 3 - 8, reopening June 9 to complete a phase of construction work for the new fire & operations facility.

The yard waste compost bins are open, they are located at the future Operations Shop area along Waskasoo Ave (RR280) a half mile North of Oxford on the east side of the road.



Operations staff have noticed many unacceptable items in the bins from black garbage bags and mulch to household waste and significantly larger than 1" in diameter tree limbs. The contractor will not accept the bins when they have non-approved items.

Please remember to follow the signs, one bin is for grass clippings and leaves, the other is for branches less the 1" in diameter and less than 4' in length.

Dumping of non-acceptable items / misuse of the yard waste bins could result discontinuation of this service.

Yard Waste Bin Reminders:

- 1.) NO DUMPING OF HOUSEHOLD ITEMS OR GARBAGE.
- 2.) Load yard waste containers from the back to the front, don't just dump your yard waste at the opening.
- 3.) Grass clippings and leaves only in the compost bin (NO BAGS, NO ANIMAL FECES).
- 4.) Branches less than 1" diameter & shorter than 4' in length in branch bin (NO STUMPS, FIREWOOD, LUMBER ETC).



Weed Control/ Spraying

You can expect to see weed spraying starting this month at various locations around Penhold. Signs will be placed advising of impacted areas. We ask that residents obey the signage and avoid the area until all signs are removed.

There are only two herbicides permitted to be used within Penhold's green spaces.

- 1.) Premium 3 way is used on the sports fields/ green spaces to control broadleaf weeds.
- 2.) Roundup is a non-selective herbicide used to control grass and weeds within tree/ shrub beds, flower beds and along the asphalt/ gravel pathways.

****When Roundup is being sprayed it is important NOT to walk in the area until it dries to avoid transferring the spray with each step taken after contact to unintended locations. There are many different views on the use of herbicide, please understand the Operations staff avoid using herbicide until it is deemed necessary to control weeds i.e. once handpicking is no longer effective and an efficient use of time/ funds.***

Gopher Control

It's getting to be that time of year again...the gophers are popping up all over Town. Moles & gophers can damage your lawn and garden. You can help control them humanely by eliminating their food source, spraying with liquid repellents, scattering repellent granules, using barriers and/or digging trenches lined with wire mesh or hardware cloth.

RV Sani Dump

RV Sani Dump is open for the season. Discount tokens for residents can be purchased through the Town Office for \$5 / token. Proof of residency is required. Tampering of the device is a fineable offence.

Summer Rainstorms



During storms and/or flooding it is important for residents to keep in mind that Operations priority is our town's water and wastewater systems. The Town of Penhold's Operations Department is mandated by Alberta Environment during an emergency to first and foremost protect life and health. We will do our best to get to your problem as soon as possible after all major threats have been dealt with. As much as a basement flooding may seem like an emergency, it will come second to the reservoir/water system and Lift Stations/sewer system.

Tips for Proper Drainage

- Create a sump pit and install a sump pump with reliable back up power; ensure pumps are operational.
- Make sure your lot is graded to aid drainage away from your home.
- Ensure sump hoses and down spouts are directed at least 6 feet away from your home's foundation.

****It is illegal to have any storm drainage discharging directly into the sewer system, check sump pumps for illegal connections. If they exist have them removed immediately as the extra flow can overload the sewer system and create sewer backups in your house. ****



Maintenance of Boulevards and Alley Ways

Residents that have grass boulevards adjacent to their properties are responsible for maintaining the area which includes edging of the grass along the sidewalk. The Town will look after any trees planted in the boulevards.

Residents with a back alley are responsible to maintain the alley grass behind their fence, prune all trees or shrubs that interfere with any public utility or public works, traffic control devices or curb sight lines, that are/or could be a public safety hazard, including lines, poles, conduits, pipes, sewer, or other works of the Town of Penhold or utility company on their premise or property

FIRE & PROTECTIVE SERVICES



Long summer nights are a great time to enjoy a fire in your backyard fire pit.

Residents are reminded to ensure they have safe fires and to check the Alberta Fire Bans website and Town website to ensure fires are legal.

The fine for having a fire in an illegal pit is \$500 and the fine for having a fire during a fire ban is \$500.

An acceptable fire pit is:

- A minimum of three meters clearance, measured from the nearest fire pit edge to the nearest edge of a building, property line, or other combustible materials (trees, wood, garbage)
- The fire chamber shall not exceed 0.5 meters cubed
- Equipped with a mesh screen with openings no larger than 6mm
- Enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete, blocks, heavy gauge metal (18 gauge- or thicker), or other non-combustible materials.
- Not located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires.

RV / Trailer Parking Reminder



RV Parking Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Can residents park an unattached RV / trailer on the road? No. RVs and trailers of any sort must be attached to a vehicle capable of towing the RV / trailer. Please remember: While, on a roadway, a trailer only has insurance coverage if the trailer is physically attached to a tow vehicle.

Can I park my RV in front of my neighbour's property? Yes. Your neighbour's property does not include the road, sidewalk or curb. However, your RV cannot be parked on the road for more than 72 hours and cannot block safe passage of any vehicles or pedestrians.

What is required to have an approved parking pad for my RV? RVs may be parked on an **approved hard surface* parking pad**** (page 68 of Land Use Bylaw) in the front yard of a residential parcel or the front or a flanking side yard of a residential parcel as long as they do not overhang the sidewalk or road.

*Hard Surface means asphalt, concrete or paving stone or similar material that is used in the construction of a driveway or parking area, but does not include gravel or granular material. (page 21 Land Use Bylaw)

**Legal Parking Pad shall include the area used as a driveway to an attached front drive garage and an area that will include the extension of the sidewalk to the front door to a maximum of 1.0m (3.28ft.) from the wall of the garage adjacent to the walk leading to the front entrance and will also include the area from the edge of the driveway to the side property line on the opposite side of the sidewalk to the front door. This parking pad shall be a hard surfaced pad used for parking vehicles or recreational vehicles in the front yard area. (page 23 Land Use Bylaw)

Are there any RV Sani-dump stations available in Penhold. Yes. There is RV Sani-dump station located on the north end of the Penhold Regional Multiplex. During regular office hours, residents can purchase Sani-Dump tokens from the Town Office at a cost of \$5 per token. Without a token, the Sani-Dump cost is \$10 using a credit card at the RV Sani-Dump Station.

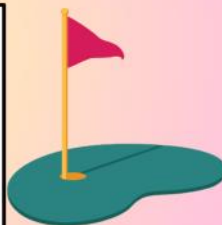
