COUNCIL CORNER

October 15 Regular Council Meeting

Third Quarter financial report:

Overall, the 3rd quarter financial report is looking close to the budget estimations. Other revenue was up due to the Fire Department's response to the provincial fires. Insurance was slightly more than anticipated.

CAO Report Highlights:

- Electronic sign will be moved at the end of October.
- Street Lighting anticipated to be fully connected east on #42
- Development in October has exceeded total cost of past 10 months with \$2.9 million.

Multiplex Report Highlights:

- Senior Men's Rustlers Hockey team has folded; vacant ice spots have been filled.
- A new tenant will occupy the concession beginning of November
- The town received \$363 for the first half of the year from Live Barn for live streaming capabilities at the rink
- Fitness area continues to do well with programs.
- 23,455 patrons visited the facility in September

Operations Report Highlights:

- Road work on ditches and dust control completed on Waskasoo Ave.
- Dust control also completed at the ball diamonds
- Welcome to Penhold sign on the north end of town blew down and is being repaired
- Emma Street will road reconstruction work will occur this fall, with the final lift put down next spring
- Winterizing parks, splash pad and RV Park
- Solar lights cleaned up for winter
- RV Park extended season for use was well received
- Operations has a full complement of staff; most summer staff have now left.

STARS Air Ambulance RFD was received as information. Council appreciates the work STARS does but felt with our proximity to major health care centres, this service level is well handled by the local fire department and ground ambulance.

Bylaw 830/2024 Fire Service Bylaw received 2nd and final readings.

Bylaw 831/2024 CAO Bylaw received 1st reading.

Key areas of change recommended:

- More detail of responsibilities as outlined throughout the MGA in one place.
- CAO may temporarily delegate acting CAO when required.
- CAO is empowered to authorize operating and capital budget if council has not approved the budget by December 31.
- Ability to waive fees to a max. of \$3,500 excluding property taxes and penalties.
- Dismissal to follow section 206 of the Act.
- Updating to current legislation.

October 28, Regular Council Meeting

CAO Report Highlights:

Acclaimed chef, Shane M. Chartrand, prepared an Indigenous cuisine for Mayors, Deputy Mayors, and CAOs from central Alberta. Shane grew up just outside of Penhold and wanted to give back to our community by creating an excellent presentation and meal for all in attendance to enjoy.

COUNCIL CORNER

Round About 2A & 42:

- A request for guard rail protection by Fas Gas has been approved by ATEC. They will be placing concrete curb jerseys along the curb 650 mm high.
- The Electronic Sign base has been poured and will be moved by the end of October.
- Street lighting to the east of the high-pressure gas line has now been activated.
- Construction signage will be coming down once all the touchups are completed.

To date we are sitting at 62 development permits for a total value of \$35.2 million dollars in 2024. Of this, \$26,572,000 is the new school build. The total development in 2023 was \$6.5 million.

Community Services Report Highlights:

The first Adulting Unlocked session on Sept. 25 was launched with car care and crisis response. These sessions are in partnership with the Library and will occur monthly, focusing on topics that help prepare youth aged 16 to 20 years with essential skills for becoming adults.

PYC received their proceeds of the Smile Cookie campaign, \$7,073.43 was raised for PYC.

Bowling Fundraiser on November 30 at Heritage Lanes, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. (See page 23)

Community Christmas will be on Friday November 22 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Multiplex.

Fire & Protective Services Report Highlights:

CPO Longstaff started in September as a Bylaw Officer and in October was appointed by the Province as a Community Peace Officer. CPO Longstaff will be working for the Town of Penhold on a part-time basis.

Firefighter and Officer of the Year 2023 attended the Canadian Wildfire Conference in Kelowna as an award from the Fire Department Association.

Provincial Legislation change on Franchise Agreements – Council supported the re-approval process of the current Franchise Agreement with ATCO Energy Systems. Information regarding the franchise agreement is outlined on page 5.

Councillor Ken Denson was sworn in as Deputy Mayor and will serve as such until February 28, 2025. Thank you to past Deputy Mayor Hamm for his work.

Council gave Bylaw 831/2024 being the CAO Bylaw second, third and final reading. This Bylaw brings clarity on the authority; powers; duties and functions of the position as outlined within various locations within the Municipal Government Act.

Council held its Organizational Meeting following the Regular Council meeting. The 2024-2025 listing of Council Representative appointments can be found on the Town website.

In light of significant changes over the past five years, including an annexation approved by the Alberta Cabinet in 2020, both the Penhold/Red Deer County IDP and Penhold MDP require updates.

Bylaw No. 825/2024 proposes to adopt the updated IDP, which will replace the 2018 version of the Plan.

Bylaw No. 826/2024 proposes to adopt the updated MDP, which will replace the 2018 Plan.

Provincial Legislation changes to Natural Gas Franchise Agreements

Since 1956, the Town of Penhold has entered into agreements with Atco Gas for natural gas services. The first agreement was for 20 years with the subsequent agreements all being for 10 year periods with the last agreement executed in 2018. The Government of Alberta recently made changes to the Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment Act, 2024 impacting current natural gas franchise agreements.

As a result of these changes, the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) is requiring the Town of Penhold to re-submit our Franchise Agreement with ATCO Gas in order for the Town to continue with the current Franchise Agreement set in place in 2018 with a 10 year term. This will continue the agreement signed in 2018, not restart the current agreement, ensuring The Town will maintain a quality partnership with ATCO Energy Systems and be compensated fairly on their utilization of Town's Right of Ways and building structures until the Agreement comes up for renewal in 2028.

Notice of application to be filed for approval of the natural gas distribution franchise agreement between the Town of Penhold and ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd

Application summary

The Alberta Utilities Commission expects to receive an application from ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. to approve the existing current and valid natural gas distribution franchise agreement with the Town of Penhold. This application for approval is required due to changes made by the *Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment Act, 2024*, to various statutes governing franchise agreements.

The current franchise agreement, which took effect in September of 2018, grants ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. the exclusive right to deliver natural gas to the residents of Town of Penhold for approximately ten years.

No changes to the franchise agreement or to the franchise fee rate rider percentage are being made as part of this application. The franchise fee rate rider percentage will remain at its current rate, which is 25%. Including linear taxes, the resulting average monthly franchise fee for an average residential customer will remain the same at approximately \$13.01. The franchise fee is calculated based on distribution charges. An average residential customer uses about 105 gigajoules per year.

SNOW SEASON REMINDERS

The Operations staff make every effort to ensure our streets are clear of snow and ice during the winter months.

Snow plowing and/or removal on streets will be started after a heavy snowfall (15cm) or once accumulations have reached 15cm.

The priority areas are as follows:

- 1** PRIORITY ONE includes main thoroughfares and bus routes.
- 2** PRIORITY TWO includes businesses, streets and avenues.
- 3** PRIORITY THREE includes Closes, Courts and Places. These are cleared once all other major areas are complete.

No Parking Signs

The Operations staff will make every attempt to put out No Parking signs the day before street sweeping or snow removal is planned. There is no parking on the road during the hours posted until the signs are removed. Vehicles are considered towable if they are not in accordance with the posted street sign (Traffic Bylaw 754.2018 Section 18.8). If the Operations crew is not able to complete street sweeping / snow removal on the day planned, the signs will remain up until work is completed.

If you are unsure when street sweeping or snow removal is taking place, you can call the Operations Dept. at 403-886-3282. Signs are placed out prior to 4:30 p.m. the day before maintenance begins. You can also receive updates to your email by signing up for the E-News through the Town of Penhold website.

Lincoln Street Storm Pond

The Lincoln Street Storm Pond is a designated and licensed snow dumping site for the Operations Department. Trucks and equipment are using the site while snow removal is in progress. Please avoid using the area during this time.

Christmas Lights on Trees on Boulevards

Some residents enjoy decorating trees within the boulevards with lights. This is acceptable; however, we ask that if residents choose to do this, they remove the Christmas lights off the trees prior to April 30 the following spring.



Storm Pond Safety

The storm pond on Lincoln Street is part of the Town's storm infrastructure and not meant for recreational use. The Community Hub Pond Aeration system runs year round and assists with the natural oxygenation process of the water body to help combat harsh winter conditions. This will result in open water throughout the winter and thin ice. Signs have been placed in the area, but we ask that people stay off this pond as well as all other storm ponds throughout town as water may be flowing underneath the surface and the ice levels are not monitored.

How it works: If you receive a ticket for specific municipal violations between November 12 and December 13, 2024 you can donate toys instead of paying the fine. Toys can be dropped off at the Town Office until the end of the day Friday December 13 and the purchase price paid must be equal to **AT LEAST 80%** of the value on your violation ticket. Toys must be new and in original packaging, and ticket holders must provide an original receipt showing the value of the toy. Gift cards are accepted (i.e. ToysRUs, Walmart, etc.) but war toys (guns, knives etc.) cannot be donated in lieu of ticket payment. The toys will be donated to the Red Deer Christmas Bureau who will distribute the toys to families in need, including Penhold families.
